Gatlinburg, Tennessee It's Crafty!

Souvenir hunting is always good in Gatlinburg and neighboring Pigeon Forge, but during the annual Craftsmen's Fair, shopping is especially illuminating. For this year's event, October 8 through 25, more than 180 artisans are scheduled to set up booths in the Gatlinburg Convention Center. So the selection will be, in a word, abundant. But what really distinguishes this festival is that in addition to selling their wares, many of the craftspeople provide a behind-the-scenes demonstration about how their pieces are made. Daily live country and bluegrass music rounds out this southeastern celebration of creativity.

panache, a ride on the African Queen is pretty sweet. Listed on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places, the boat was originally constructed to transport cargo and travelers, but shot to stardom in 1951's namesake film, when Humphrey Bogart and Katharine Hepburn used it to navigate treacherous waters and an awkward partnership during WWI. The classic steamship has since been restored, and now plies the canals of Key Largo on 90-minute sightseeing excursions and two-hour dinner outings - crocodiles and enemy battleships not included.

Myrtle Beach, South Carolina Blue Ribbon Attraction

Brookgreen Gardens is much more than a botanical wonderland of blooming black-eyed Susans, chrysanthemums, and spider lilies. There's a zoo here, too, and plenty of historical programs. And from August 8 to November 1, the popular Murrells Inlet attraction will be home to the National Sculpture Society 82nd Annual Awards Exhibition. In all, 15 formal prizes are given out, but the juried display — a collection of figures imagined by both well-established sculptors and those you'll be hearing from in the future — is an equally rewarding experience for all who witness it.

Whether you prefer your green eggs and ham with a goat or on a boat, associate with the Sneetches on their beaches, or just enjoy the adventures of Cindy Lou Who, it's hard to deny the unadulterated joy Dr. Seuss inspires. And now through December 31, you can rediscover that pure delight at the San Diego History Center's *Ingenious! The World of Dr. Seuss* exhibit, where engaging displays and family-oriented activities highlight his fantastical art.

Branson, MissouriFour of a Kind

On December 4, 1956, four musicians showed up at Memphis, Tennessee's Sun Records studio. Their names were Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis, Carl Perkins, and Elvis Presley. By all accounts, the result was one of the most legendary jam sessions of all time. It's also the inspiration for the musical *Million Dollar Quartet*, a production that includes a multitude of hits, from "Blue Suede Shoes" to "Great Balls of Fire" to "I Walk the Line." This can't-miss show is scheduled to play Branson's Welk Resort Theatre June through December.





Lake Havasu, ArizonaLight up Your Vacation

The folks at Walt Disney World are dreaming big with **Disney Springs**, a new complex inspired by the Sunshine State's turn-of-the-century waterfront towns and natural beauty. Rolling out in phases as part of a multiyear makeover, Disney Springs is set to replace Downtown Disney in 2016. Welcoming visitors with a new gateway and water tower, its four interconnected neighborhoods — Town Center, The Landing, West Side, and Marketplace — will boast more than 150 entertainment, dining, and shopping options (double that of Downtown Disney), surrounded by beautiful lakefront and bubbling springs.

or 25 years, Universal Orlando has been scaring the wits out of parkgoers during its annual **Halloween Horror Nights** event. And to celebrate this milestone anniversary, the 2015 edition — which runs select nights from September 1 through November 1 — is sure to be the biggest ever. Those who dare enter will encounter haunted houses, multiple scare zones, and live shows. Top Hollywood gore fests such as *An American*

Werewolf in London, Halloween, and The Walking Dead have made appearances over the past few years, so expect the crème de la crème of creepy. This is not for the faint of heart!

Located in a historic country store near Orlando in downtown Gotha, Yellow Dog Eats delivers a scrumptious spectrum of original creations,



proving you can wander slightly off the beaten path and be greatly rewarded.

THE SETTING: The Dog is as much about its ambiance as its food. A fun and intimate air permeates the establishment. Tables proudly wear the scars from the pens of past diners, trinkets line the shelves, and art adorns the walls including a portrait of the pooch that gave the place its name. There's also a lush outdoor garden with plenty of tables with umbrellas, string lights, and a VW minivan.

THE MENU: The restaurant is the brainchild of Culinary Institute of America alum Fish Morgan, so you're in good hands here. Nosh on out-of-theordinary sandwiches (including pulled pork that is smoked on premises), barbecue plates, vegetarian dishes, and Scooby Snacks (sides such as Greek orzo salad and homemade coleslaw). Daily specials, rotating draft beers, and a well-rounded wine menu complete the lineup.

On the menu, which celebrates the myriad cultures represented on the island chain and is crafted from locally sourced ingredients, expect to find rissoles (Portuguese shrimp turnovers), a roast pork ramen bowl, and slow-braised honeymustard short ribs. among other dishes.

Beginning September 27, Maui's Kula Country Farms — a fourth generation, family-operated farm on the Upcountry hills of Kula — opens its pumpkin patch to the public. When not searching for the perfect specimen, plenty of other activities will keep you busy: There's a sevenhole minigolf course, a corn maze to wander through, bocce ball to play, grazing horses to admire, and food to purchase for a picnic. Or just sit back and enjoy the breathtaking panoramas that stretch all the way to the ocean. The pumpkin patch is open Tuesday to Sunday through October.







Traveling chile aficionados find equal parts pleasure and pain in fiery world cuisines.

Mistake number one: Spooning a generous glop of the mystery sauce onto my noodles without sampling it first. The result? A sensation akin to tongue tasering, triggering tears and sweat as I grabbed for my water. That was mistake number two — water only fanned the flames. My knowing friend shoved his Singha toward me, and Thailand's national beer seemed to calm the fire ignited by the bird's eye chile sauce. It was then that I understood why there was a box of tissues at every table in the Bangkok restaurant.

Chiles originated in Mexico, but we can credit colonial explorers for spreading these spicy peppers throughout the world. Today, they are as much at home in the temperate-clime cuisines of Hungary and Italy as in subtropical Jamaica. Chiles play well with a rainbow of ingredients, enhancing signature tastes while exhibiting their own personality. Whether jerk chicken, Indian vindaloo, or Tabasco-spiked New Orleans crawfish étouffée, those dishes that register on the Scoville scale are proof that there is a thin line between pleasure and pain.



TOM YUM SOUP

The list of ingredients for Thailand's treasured soup may look intimidating, but most can be found in your grocery's international section or in Asian specialty food shops. The recipe is surprisingly easy.

- 4 cups water or broth (chicken or vegetable)
- 2 stalks lemongrass
- 1-inch piece fresh galangal or ginger, peeled and chopped
- 3 Kaffir lime leaves
- 2 limes, juiced
- 1 tablespoon fish sauce
- 5 medium mushrooms, sliced
- 2 bird's eye chiles (or a milder chile to taste)
- 2 tablespoons chile paste (optional)
- 1 pound chicken or shrimp (cooked) or tofu

2 green onions, chopped 1 handful cilantro, torn

Heat liquid to a boil. Bruise the stalks of lemongrass with the side of a knife and add to the pot, along with the galangal and Kaffir lime leaves, and simmer for 15 minutes. Strain out the lemongrass, galangal, and lime leaves. Add lime juice, fish sauce, mushrooms, chiles, chile paste, and protein. Simmer 15 minutes. Add green onions and cilantro, stir, and serve. Serves 4.

CHILES RELLENOS

This Mexican favorite is typically made with poblanos, but you can also use New Mexico green chiles or Anaheims.

- 12 large whole poblano chiles
- 1 pound crumbled *queso fresco* or shredded Monterey Jack
- 3 eggs, large
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon baking powder High-heat cooking oil for frying
- 1 cup flour

Roast the whole peppers, either directly on a gas burner or under the broiler, turning until every side is blackened evenly. Place in a sealed plastic bag for about 10 minutes, or until cool enough to handle. Take out of the bag and remove the charred skin.

Make one slice lengthwise and carefully remove seeds and veins, leaving the stem attached. Fill halfway with cheese, close, and set aside.

For the batter, separate egg yolks from the whites, and place whites in a mixing bowl. Add salt and baking powder, then whip until stiff peaks form. Mix in yolks to create a soft, fluffy mixture.

Heat one-half inch of oil in a heavybottomed frying pan until it ripples. Dredge each pepper in the flour until coated, dip in the egg mixture, and place in pan. Turn until all sides are browned. Remove and drain on paper towel. Top with salsa or chile sauce. Serves 6.

NEW MEXICO GREEN CHILE SAUCE

For the most authentic result, look for New Mexico Hatch chiles. In a pinch, go for poblano — or jalapeño if you want more kick.

2 cups green chiles
1 tablespoon olive oil
1/2 cup onion, chopped
1 clove garlic, minced
1 tablespoon flour
1/2 cup chicken or

vegetable stock 1/2 cup tomato, chopped (fresh or canned)

3/4 teaspoon cumin Salt to taste

Roast and skin the chiles as in the chiles rellenos recipe (above). Remove seeds, chop, and set aside. Heat the oil in a skillet or Dutch oven, and saute the onion until transparent. Add garlic and cook a minute. Add flour, stirring for about 2 minutes. Slowly add the stock, stirring until smooth. Add the chiles, tomatoes, cumin, and salt. Cover and simmer for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add stock to reach desired consistency. Produces approximately 3 cups of chile sauce.

Around the World in Chiles

Take Mexico, for example. Working with a veritable A-list — the approachable poblano, the flirtatious jalapeño, and the outrageous habanero, to name a few — the birthplace of chiles serves up favorites from cayenne-spiced chocolate to complex *mole* sauces. The versatile chile is a beloved regular at any meal, freshly chopped in salsa, powdered on mango slices, stuffed with cheese, or smoked and simmered into aromatic stews.

Chiles are hot throughout the southwestern U.S., of course. But New Mexico's love affair with its own New Mexico chile — a mildly hot pepper — has led to the official state question: "Red or green?" Here, *chile* is a sauce made from either unripe green chiles or dried red chiles. "Christmas" is the answer if you can't choose between the two.

Thailand loves its peppers, too. Notorious for some of the hottest dishes on the planet, the country embraces its long, thin bird's eyes, and generously adds them to soups, salads, and curries.

Feel the Burn

It's the compound capsaicin that triggers the burn you get from a bite of blackened fish or a salsa-laden burrito. Concentrated in the pepper's membrane, seeds, and veins, capsaicin reacts with the mouth's soft tissue, sending signals to the brain that something hot has entered the body. The heart rate rises, perspiration is generated, and chemicals are released.

Among those chemicals are endorphins, the feel-good substances also triggered by meditation, laughter, and physical exercise, which can result in stress reduction and even euphoria. No wonder we go back for more.

But when you get too much of a good thing, the best antidote is cold milk. The casein in dairy products neutralizes the capsaicin and eases the burning. Although not nearly as effective as milk, other antidotes include alcoholic beverages, starchy foods such as rice, and sugar water.

Too Hot to Handle

Those who've cooked with chiles know that the oils from fresh, chopped peppers can burn the skin. And woe is the cook who makes the mistake of rubbing his or her eyes after cutting up a handful of jalapeños! The best advice is to wear latex or rubber gloves when handling peppers. If it's too late, cold milk is a soothing soak for the skin.

Car Talk Paving the Way for a Successful Road Trip

Long-distance car travel has improved a lot in the last decade or so. Interstates are clustered with more lodgings, restaurants, and gas stations than ever. The navigator is no longer a person who sits up front with maps spread across the dashboard, but rather a disembodied voice directing your route. And the kids aren't limited to reading comics and counting license plates. Instead, they're playing electronic games or plugging into their personal DVD players to watch the latest animated movie.

Advances in roadside services, navigation, and in-car entertainment aside, road travel remains an adventure, especially for families embarking on a vacation. And whether you're making a two-hour trip or a day's journey, proper preparation can mean the difference between an enjoyable ride — and a nightmare of a drive.

Getting ready for a drive-to vacation requires a little forethought, but the effort is well worth it.

Planning Your Route

Going from here to there may be simpler than ever, with navigation systems and apps to guide you, and even steer you away from road construction and traffic congestion. But still, it pays to familiarize your-

self with the recommended route ahead of time, and to consider your priorities: Do you want to get to your destination as fast as possible? Or would you prefer the most scenic way, even if it means a longer trip? Also, it's wise to pack printed directions and a map, just in case of any technical problems.

Getting Your Car Road-Ready

Ensuring that your vehicle can get you to your destination efficiently and safely is the most important aspect of preparing for your drive. Nothing can dampen enthusiasm like an overnight stop while your brakes are being repaired, or a long drive through the desert without air conditioning.

Shortly before your trip, take the car in for a tuneup: Fill and rotate the tires as needed - keep in mind you may need to adjust the air pressure depending upon the weight of the load. Change the oil. Check fluids. Make sure everything is working, including headlights, windshield wipers, turn signals, and the defogger.

Preparing for Trouble

Don't let a car emergency derail your journey. In addition to keeping your road-service membership up to date, be prepared in case of a breakdown: Pack jumper cables, a flashlight, and a warning light or reflective hazard triangles. Make sure your spare tire is in the trunk and in usable condition. (Now might also be a good time to learn how to change a tire, if you don't already know.) Take a car charger to keep your cell phone juiced so you can call emergency assistance if necessary.

Making It Fun

There are lots of ways to assure a pleasant journey and eliminate the "Are we there yet?" refrain from the back seat.

Stock up on (or download) passenger pastimes: music, movies, audiobooks, podcasts, and games - electronic and otherwise.

Plan for plenty of comfort stops. Walk around a bit when filling up the tank. And although it's wise to pack snacks, there's value in stopping for a sit-down meal in a restaurant from time to time.

Schedule fun breaks, too. Take the exit and see that famous cave advertised on billboards for the past 100 miles. Visit that Civil War battlefield or odd museum. Even a round of putt-putt golf can provide diversion and a pick-me-up.

Driving breaks are particularly important for the driver. Stop for a 15-minute power nap if the caffeine isn't keeping you alert. ■



All-Inclusive, Defined

What exactly is an all-inclusive resort? In a nutshell, it's a property that includes added amenities, services, and/or food and drinks with your stay via an all-inclusive package. Packages vary by property; most include all of your meals, snacks, and drinks (usually alcoholic beverages), as well as many onsite activities.

Identifying all-inclusives is easy: Just look for the tin the online or printed Resort Directory. You can also find an Index to All-Inclusive Resorts in the Directory.

Leave Your Cash Behind

One of the key perks of all-inclusives: With nearly everything paid for upfront, you can get money off the brain, and focus on enjoying the moment rather than racking up charges. Think of it like you would a cruise - with drinks included!

The vast majority of the added bells and whistles all-inclusives offer are covered by a per-person, per-day fee paid directly to the resort. Prices vary and are determined by the resort. Each property bases its supplemental package price on a number of factors, including how many restaurants are on the property, the type of food and beverages served, and the assortment of available activities. Many resorts require the purchase of the allinclusive package for the entire stay; at others, you may be able to pay the all-inclusive supplement for less than a full week, or it may be optional altogether. Note that the all-inclusive fee is in addition to the exchange or Getaway fee that you pay Interval.

And if you're traveling with children, based on their ages, their all-inclusive fees are often discounted — sometimes by more than 50 percent. At some resorts, there might be no charge for the youngest of travelers (3 and under, for example).

To find out an all-inclusive fee, call the Member-Services Center at 800.INTERVAL for mandatory all-inclusives, or contact the resort if the all-inclusive fee is optional. If you're booking online, fee information will be available before you confirm your exchange or Getaway.



ParadiseFOUND



s the airport shuttle approaches the grounds of Le Blanc Spa Resort, I feel a growing sense of awe. Nestled between the Nichupté Lagoon and the Caribbean Sea on an exquisite stretch of beach, the AAA Five Diamond, all-inclusive, adults-only property is known for its chic design, high level of service (the employee-guest ratio is reportedly almost one-to-one), 19-room spa, four white-linen restaurants, and multiple pools. Modern, flowing lines highlight the property's architecture, and soft accent lights play off an airy, off-white lobby with diaphanous drapes that separate the check-in and waiting areas. My wife, Kat, and I are given sweet coconut milk and introduced to our butler, Israel. From arranging dining reservations and outings to the Mayan ruins of Chichén Itzá and Tulum to perfectly preparing bubble baths, each of Le Blanc's butlers — there's one for every guest floor —attends to the needs and desires of visitors.

Israel welcomes us and shows us to our room, a corner suite with two sliding doors overlooking the stunning turquoise sea below. The 260 rooms throughout Le Blanc's triangular tower feature a host of fabulous comforts, including two-person jetted tubs; mirrors with embedded televisions; Bulgari amenities; dual sideby-side showers with multiple nozzles; a replenishing minibar full of water, sodas, snacks, and beer; and a pull-out bar featuring pre-

mium liquors including Johnnie Walker Black Label. Combine that with unlimited, full-menu room service and the swoon-worthy views of the water and beach below from our sixth-story balcony perch, and once settled in, we decide this would be one of the best vacations of our lives — even if we never left the room.

"This is how rock stars live," Kat muses, as a gentle ocean breeze plays with the curtains in front of our open balcony door. "I'm almost afraid to get used to this. Almost."

True, at first we were a little uncomfortable with being treated like royalty at every turn, but we quickly adjust. This is, after all, why we keep returning to all-inclusive vacations: For an upfront price, we don't touch our wallets for the rest of the week. Every drink, meal, amenity, and courtesy is included, with no extra expectation of tipping or additional payment. It's obvious Le Blanc takes excellent care of its staff, and that they enjoy meeting people from all over the world. Israel gets a kick out of helping me with my less-than-perfect Spanish. He and all of the staff speak excellent English.

Soon we melt into the unstructured rhythm of living the life allinclusive at Le Blanc. Our biggest decisions include which room scent to select for the day (vanilla or sandalwood) and whether to go with a lavender- or chamomile-scented pillow for the evening.



We float about the property, enjoying perfectly made mojitos and other drinks from Le Blanc's five bars. And when we're hungry, we're spoiled for choice with Le Blanc's excellent restaurants.

Open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner, BlancInternational offers a bounty of enticing fare, such as steak, seafood, sushi, salads, pastas, cheese, fruit, and desserts that cater to Le Blanc's diverse, sophisticated international clientele. Other evening options include BlancItalia and BlancOrient, which seem to vie for the title of best cuisine on property. The only restaurant we need reservations for is Lumiere, where we savor a French-fusion, seven-course tasting dinner that includes escargot, seared scallops, and filet mignon.

Another must-experience is Le Blanc's signature spa, and Kat nobly volunteers. Treatments do cost extra, but we received a resort credit at check-in that we can use. With options ranging from hydrotherapy and facials to deep-tissue and Mayan four-hands massage, selecting her treatment is a tough call — considerably more difficult than the room-scent decision. She disappears for hours into the tranquil, candle-lit space, and avails herself of the sauna, relaxation room, and hot tub before and after her Swedishinspired serenity massage.

As our week progresses, we come to discover that Le Blanc is

far more than just eating, drinking, and lazing. The warm, clear Caribbean Sea begs for swimming and body surfing. Kat takes advantage of the fully equipped gym and yoga classes while I explore off-property at the Museo Maya de Cancún (at the suggestion of Israel), where I learn about the Yucatán Peninsula's first inhabitants. We later discuss our day lounging in the infinity pool overlooking the sea, never far from the swim-up bar. Fully relaxed, we begin to muse about a return visit to Cancún with our parents and kids, who they've been watching while we bliss out in paradise. While Le Blanc is perfect for us this week, there are many other allinclusive resorts in the area that cater to a wide variety of clientele, from other high-end properties to mid-range — yet equally amenity-

filled — family-friendly resorts. But for right now, we're enjoying our timeless week at Le Blanc like newlyweds, and can't imagine being anywhere else.

By Steve Larese With endless local flavor and water pursuits galore, this Caribbean diving hotspot is paradise onshore and offshore.

ea fans wave as I glide along the coralencrusted outcrop, mesmerized by the life teeming in this warm (84°F!), ginclear water. Sergeant majors school by, their yellow and black stripes

reminding me of bumblebees buzzing about in some colorful garden. A seemingly bored puffer fish is undisturbed as a bright-blue parrotfish and several horse-eye jacks dart past. Suddenly, our dive master, Mal Forrest, points excitedly over my shoulder, and I turn to see an enormous eagle ray pass right over my head, eclipsing the sun as it elegantly soars past us. I'm ecstatic, and even more so when a green sea turtle follows in its wake.

I'm scuba diving with Sun Divers on my first morning in Roatán, Honduras, and I've already seen what has filled a week during other trips. The Mesoamerican Reef, the second largest in the world, rims this Caribbean island north of the Honduran mainland, making it a world-renowned diving destination. Dive flags and shops dot the 30-mile-long coast, making it abundantly clear that much of the action here is offshore and underwater.

The hour of diving goes by all too fast, and with my tank at 700 pounds per square inch, it's time to make our three-minute safety stop and head back to the boat. Surfacing, I feel like a kid being called in from recess, but there's plenty I want to explore out of the water, too. My wife, Kat, isn't a diver, but has been having an equally fantastic time relaxing and reading on the Half Moon Bay beach in the West End. I meet her there, and we get \$5 plates of excellent grilled jerk chicken and plantains before setting off to explore this part of the island.

The colorful West End is considered to be the happening part of the island, where bars cater to Jimmy Buffet lovers and divers



alike. Shops sell beach clothes, locally made jewelry, and wood carvings, and residents still talk about how happy they are that the main road was paved a few years ago.

We stop in at the nonprofit Roatán Marine Park to learn about the reef and what's being done to safeguard it. In 2010, Roatán's coast was designated a protected marine park by the Honduran government and, due to its conservation efforts, the reef's health is improving despite the invasive lionfish population, which has been decimating native species. Fortunately, Kat and I soon learn that the lionfish may be trouble for other aquatic creatures, but for us humans, they are delicious.

For dinner, we head to Lionfish Louie's, a beach restaurant located near the center of the island at the Havana Beach Club on Big Bight.


"It tastes like walleye," says Jack Mitchell, owner of the eatery, of the lionfish. "It's a white meat that doesn't taste fishy at all."

Mitchell loves the grouper-tasting lionfish so much, he opened his restaurant in 2014, and serves ceviche, enchiladas, fish and chips, and other appetizers and entrees using only locally caught lionfish.

Swimming Through History

The next day, after having witnessed a 6-foot-long moray eel swim past me during my dive with Bananarama Dive Shop, we set off to explore West Bay, a small community on Roatán's western tip, next to the West End. West Bay is quieter and doesn't have as many shops, but the beach here is long and wide. A 10-minute water taxi ride takes you back and forth between West End and West Bay for \$3, so it's easy to visit even if you don't have a car. Kat takes the morning to unwind with an aromatherapy massage at Serenity Day Spa, then we stroll the beach and watch artist Gladys Agustin paint intricate African-Caribbean style portraits at her beach booth before heading out to Monterroso's Bay Islands Underwater Museum at Sandy Bay, where we literally swim through Roatán's history. (Since my visit, the museum has moved to Las Palmas, on the south side of the island.)

The Mayas had a presence here, but it was the Paya people who greeted Christopher Columbus when he stepped ashore on Roatán in 1509. During the 1600s, English pirates, including Blackbeard and John Coxen (for which the island's largest town, Coxen Hole, is named), used Roatán as a base for attacking Spanish ships. We snorkel through the clear, sunlit water to find replica statues from the Mayan and Paya cultures no more than 10 feet beneath the surface. And at the end of the tour, we get a real treat: the ribs of a real Spanish galleon teeming with fish. It's a great way for nondivers to experience the beauty of the reef and even wreck dive.

ON THE MAINLAND

La Ceiba

What: It's the ecotourism and entertainment capital of Honduras. It's most famous for its San Isidro festival, which draws hundreds of thousands of tourists, as well as its white-sand beaches. La Ceiba is surrounded by nature preserves, including Pico Bonito National Park, one of the most biodiverse places on the planet. The nearby Cangreial River offers exciting Class II, III, and IV white-water rafting.

Getting There: Safe Way Maritime Transportation offers ferry rides between Roatán and La Ceiba daily, with one-way trips taking about an hour and 10 minutes. Round-trip tickets start at \$64.

Don't Miss: Enjoy local seafood in a gorgeous setting at Itzama, a restaurant inside the park.

Eastward

So far we've been exploring Roatán's western half; the following day, we set out to explore the less-visited eastern half. Of course, there are plenty of excellent dive shops and sites here, too. After I head out for the morning with Barefoot Divers, exploring coral-encrusted slot canyons created by an earthquake, Kat and I set out to find Arch's Iguana & Marine Park at French Cay.

In 1980, after having watched the ecology of his home impacted, Sherman Arch forbade iguana hunting and egg collecting on his extensive property. Instead, he began feeding the reptiles. Their numbers rebounded, and soon tourists began making pilgrimages to his home to view hundreds of free-range iguanas.

On the day that Kat and I visit, scores of them sun themselves in his driveway, as docile as house cats — that is until Arch produces a clump of leaves for feeding; then they come running, climbing over one another to get to the food.

Impressed with Arch's conservation efforts, we set off for Punta Gorda, a village settled by the Garifuna in 1797. The Garifuna are an

African-Caribbean people who were marooned on Roatán by the British after uprisings in the Lesser Antilles. They went on to establish a village, and their culture and language thrive to this day. We stop at Ruthie's Garifuna Cuisine and order fried fish as locals slam dominoes down on the table next to us. Ruthie brings us a whole fried fish, caught that day, and we watch children play in the water as wooden fishing canoes come in with bigger fish to fry.

Well-fed and back in the car, we drive as pavement soon gives way to a dirt road. Eventually, we see a sign for Marble Hill Farms, and turn not knowing what to expect. We find, seemingly hidden in the jungle, a gourmet kitchen serving wood-oven pizza, with stunning views from a two-story watchtower called the Crow's Nest. We sample jams, including key lime, pineapple, papaya, cinnamon, and island plum, made from the on-property 24-acre orchard. We could spend all day just taking in the sweeping panoramic scene of jungle and sea, but there's still road to travel. Bouncing along again, we drive through the small village of Diamond Rock as the sky begins to turn pink with sundown. Just as we think we should turn around and

beat the darkness, we see a boardwalk leading to a small building surrounded by calm sea.

La Sirena at Camp Bay is the last bar on the island before you run out of road at the undeveloped Saint Helene Marine Park. Owner Jimmy Andrade and his wife, Carmen, welcome us and set down two cold Salva Vida beers. The water laps between the slats on the floor below us.

We walk out on the dock and sip our beers as the Caribbean stars begin to shine, and soon the Milky Way stretches above us. Kat and I discuss our plans for tomorrow — there are beaches to choose from and dives to take. But soon we grow silent, just taking in the Roatán night at the end of the road on this slice of Caribbean paradise.

ON THE MAINLAND

Copán Ruins Archaeological Park

What: Close to Honduras' border with Guatemala, the ruins are a can't-miss for archeology buffs. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is called the Paris of the Mayan World, and is one of its largest and bestpreserved capital cities. Mayan carvings and hieroglyphic text cover this site, which flourished from the fifth to ninth centuries. Visitors can view the remains of the Acropolis the royal center of Copán, an impressive tunnel system, ceremonial ball court, plazas surrounded by sculptures, and many freestanding portraits carved into stone called stelae. The Hieroglyphic Stairway, which contains a carved history of the Mayan rulers of Copán, is renowned for its quality, and has yet




to be fully deciphered. Visit the on-site museum for more backstory. Accredited guides will cost about \$30 and are well worth it. Entrance to the park is \$15.

Getting There: To reach Copán from Roatán, take a quick puddle jumper flight into San Pedro Sula; from there, it's a three-hour bus ride to the ruins.

Don't Miss: Be sure to explore the small village of Copán Ruinas itself, which can be easily walked, and boasts numerous shops and restaurants for a real taste of Honduras.

It's not ski season and it's not summertime, but with plenty to do and even more to eat, there's a great chance you'll fall for **Breckenridge,** Colorado.

Let's be honest: Fall routinely gets short shrift when it comes to discussing the seasonal joys of North America's most popular ski towns. And reports from Breckenridge, Colorado, typically aren't much different. Wintertime here is praised for its average annual snowfall of nearly 30 feet. The summer months are hailed as the season when warm days are filled with endless outdoor activities. And spring ... well, people love spring because after a few months of all that powder, even the most hardcore skiers and snowboarders are ready for some bright, sunny days. Then there's fall, when the go-to highlight is the fact that the weather is beginning to cool down again, which means it's about time for another 30 feet of snow.

The secret reality, though, is that for many travelers, fall is an ideal time to visit high country.

Most school-age children return to classes by September, and the aforementioned hardcore skiers and snowboarders won't be showing up for another few weeks. (The ski resort usually opens mid- to late November.) In other words, aside from a weekend festival or two, crowds are scarce.

Things to do, however, are not. Fall in Breckenridge is like a mountain-town sampler platter. Sure, some of the local businesses may be taking time off, and no, you probably won't get to carve or schuss the 2,908 acres of ski and snowboard terrain, but that just gives you more time to check out all the other activities and attractions that are available in and around this old mining community. Or, if you prefer, the quieter scene affords ample opportunity to do not much at all. Find a park bench and finish one of the novels from your summer-reading list. Go for a walk. Sit by a stream.

Surprised at those mellow outdoor suggestions? That's another regional secret. September and October weather remains relatively pleasant. Average daily highs are in the mid-60s and low 50s respectively. It cools down another 10 degrees in November, but as long as the Colorado sun is shining (as it usually is), it always feels warmer.

So don't worry that fall is Breckenridge's somewhat forgotten season. You'll have no trouble filling your days with as much or as little recreation as you'd like. Read on for a few ideas about how to spend your time.

Go Fish

Mountain biking and road cycling are popular throughout the region. Routes range from the flat, wide 6.5-mile Tiger Road to the Dyersville mining settlement ride, which is a 16-mile loop with an elevation gain of 1,600 feet. There's also the Blue River Recreation Path, which provides miles of paved pedaling between Breckenridge and Frisco. The hiking, of course, is also fantastic. And as long as you don't mind crossing a snowfield or two at higher elevations, it can be done well into fall.

One activity you might not automatically consider, but certainly should, is fly-fishing. "The fish are active year-round, so we can fish every month of the year," says Jackson Streit of Breckenridge-based

Mountain Angler outfitters. "And actually, fall is a time when the big brown trout start moving up the rivers to spawn. So while some of these big fish may have been sitting in deep holes all summer, now they're on the move, and we can find them in places where you normally wouldn't be able to."

Mountain Angler offers a variety of guided fishing trips, including half- and full-day walking excursions. For prime conditions in September and October, Streit suggests a float-fishing trip on the Colorado River. "It's also nice because it's at a lower altitude than here in Breckenridge, so while we may have a high in the mid-40s here in town, where

we're going, it might be in the mid-60s," he says. "That's really the magic time of year."

There are plenty of other magical spots, too. About 30 minutes south of Breckenridge in the South Park area, near Fairplay, large brown trout that have worked their way up from the Spinney Mountain Reservoir can be found in abundance, says Streit. Heading in the opposite direction about 20 minutes north of Breckenridge, another bustling population of brown trout can be found in Lake Dillon. "We get a good run out of there," he says. "You'd definitely have a chance to catch a 20-plus-inch brown that time of year."

High-Altitude Shopping

If your idea of landing a prize catch requires more wandering from store to store and (much) less wading along the banks of a flowing stream, make haste for Breckenridge's Main Street. Park near either the north or south end, and simply start walking — and gawking. There are more than 200 shops concentrated in this downtown district, an assortment that's utterly impossible to comprehend until you're actually strolling past all of them.

Looking for regional souvenirs? You'll find all sorts of T-shirts and trinkets emblazoned with witty phrases about Colorado's altitude alongside hats and other paraphernalia with the state flag at numerous gift stores. Or you could choose a fine-art print depicting one of the nearby 14ers (mountains that top out above 14,000 feet high), an aspen grove, or Main Street itself, from most any of the local galleries.

Don't really know what you're looking for? Yep, there are plenty of those shops, too: handcrafted clothing, jewelry, toys, sports gear — the list goes on and on.

With so many places to swipe your credit card right in the heart of Breckenridge, it's almost out of the question to think of going elsewhere to get your shopping fix. It should be noted, however, that just 14 miles up the road, the Outlets At Silverthorne offers some pretty tempting discounts on name brands, including Aeropostale, Ann Taylor, Coach, Columbia, Gap, Guess, and Nike.

There's a Samsonite Company Store, too, in case you need an extra suitcase to get all your treasures home.


Serious Sustenance

co for the Gold One dazzling scene that's only on display during fall is the annual changing of the colors in Colorado's mountainside forests. Come September, grove after grove of aspen trees begin to erupt with suddenly brilliant golden leaves (seemingly overnight in some cases), while the occasional cottonwood stand adds a few pockets of contrasting reds and oranges. Driving over Boreas Pass Road, which ascends to about 11,400 feet, is typically considered the best fall foliage route, but it's also just the beginning. Add Hoosier Pass for a longer loop, or head over to French Gulch and the B&B Mines Trailhead for a scenic walk among countless aspens.

For an extensive beer selection coupled with Buffalo wings, pizzas, hamburgers, and other pub fare, slide into a booth at Downstairs At Eric's, billed as "Breckenridge's favorite family sports bar." And definitely make time to visit the Breckenridge Brewery & Pub for their portobello mushroom sandwich and seasonal Autumn Ale.

For a nice night out, look no further than the Briar Rose Chophouse & Saloon. It's named after the Briar Rose silver mine and is located at the site of what once served as a boarding house for the men who originally worked there. "Our bar was built in 1883," says David Lipka, the restaurant's general manager. "There's a lot of history, and we do a great casual saloon atmosphere. For people who come in and want the high-end meal, we have white-tablecloth dining in our main room."

As for that high-end meal, Lipka says two dishes stand out: "The elk medallions and bonein buffalo ribeye (shown at left) are easily my favorites," he says.

Fall is an extra-special time to dine at the Briar Rose. Each year, typically beginning in October, a seasonal prix fixe dinner is offered as part of the Breckenridge Restaurant Association's Dining Passport program, says Lipka, followed by two-for-one entrees in November.

"You know, the town slows down a little, but we don't close," Lipka says. "It's nice for the locals, and great for the visitors."

Oh, and in response to the question you're no doubt longing to ask: Yes, says Lipka, both

the elk and bone-in buffalo are available as two-for-one dinner options. Which, honestly, is almost reason enough by itself to make a fall trip to Breckenridge.

Freelance writer Lon Winters has yet to reel in a 20-inch brown trout, but he's made up for it by devouring Briar Rose elk medallions on more than one off-season stop in Breckenridge.



Happiness in Traveling

Sunset casts a noticeable calm over Cartagena's Old Town. The motorcyclists slow down and follow the rules of the road more diligently. The throngs of people shuffling to and fro on the sidewalks disperse. And many of the little cars that scurry along the narrow roadways like mice in a maze during daylight hours retreat to unseen nocturnal sanctuaries. This final detail is the most important, because at this point of the story I'm actually sitting in the street. At a rickety, unbalanced high-top table with my wife, Michelle, and a couple of cold Aguila beers.

The makeshift patio seating is courtesy of a handful of somewhat anonymous establishments — a pizza joint, a *very* casual steakhouse, a hole-in-the-wall bar, and a couple others — all opposite the Plaza Fernández de Madrid. We had been on our way to dinner at El Burlador de Sevilla, a popular, not-at-all-anonymous Spanish restaurant, but the sight of the tables set up on the street in this less-touristy part of town was simply too tempting to pass up. It was also made clear that by sitting at any of the tables, we'd be able to order food and drinks from *any* of the nearby eateries.

"Oh, we have to check this out," Michelle said.

I understand it doesn't sound like much. *Outdoor seating ...* what's the big deal? To be clear, though, the street in question is not some boulevard that's been permanently closed to traffic and transformed into a pedestrian-friendly walkway. Less than two hours before we sat down, we'd sauntered past the same spot and witnessed a taxi cut the corner so tight that the rear tire screeched against the same curb that Alfredo, a big gentleman with glasses and a penchant for horizontally striped polo shirts, has to step off to bring us another round of Aguila.

I admit that the first few times I saw headlights approaching the intersection, I girded myself, ready to grab Michelle and dive full Hollywood-style for the sidewalk. But then Alfredo sidled up to our table with a pint-size bottle of Aguardiente Antioqueño, three widerimmed shot glasses, and a bowl of limes. Aguardiente is regarded as the national liquor of Colombia. It's distilled from sugarcane and very light. Alfredo poured three servings, raised his glass, and said, "Bienvenidos a Cartagena." I pulled out my wallet, but he stopped me. "Gratis, amigo," he added.

Three things happened thanks to that spontaneous exchange: I stopped watching for headlights, we missed dinner, and, most importantly, we learned that the most rewarding way to experience Cartagena is to simply show up and see what happens.

Open-Ended Itinerary

Cartagena was founded in 1533. In 1586, work began on the military fortifications that transformed the settlement into a Spanish colonial stronghold. Today, that area is known as Old Town. Essentially, it's made up of three neighborhoods, two of which, El Centro and San Diego, remain almost completely encircled by the original walls — Las Murallas — and blend rather seamlessly into each other. The other is the up-and-coming, bohemian Getsemaní. The entire district is on UNESCO's World Heritage List.

And there are historic highlights to be sure. The spired clock tower marks what used to be the primary entrance to the walled city. The Convent and Church of San Pedro Claver as well as the Church and Monastery of Santo Domingo are stunning. The Palacio de la Inquisición, once a palace and now a museum, offers a glimpse at the region's innovative — and sometimes brutal — beginnings. And the nearby Castillo de San Felipe de Barajas fortress is particularly fascinating.

All of these attractions should be on your formal itinerary, but so should wandering around El Centro and San Diego with no plan whatsoever, because that's when you might happen across your own Alfredo. (I've yet to see him mentioned in any guidebook.) To that end, we set out the next morning with just one item on our agenda: Get lost in Cartagena.

It didn't take long. Less than 10 minutes into our journey, Michelle stopped. "Weren't we just on Calle de la Moneda?" she asked.

"Yes."

"Did we turn a corner?"

"No." We had crossed an intersection, but certainly hadn't altered our path.

"Well, now we're on Calle de la Cruz," she said, and pointed to the sign.

Turns out, the street names change from block to block, even if you maintain your course. What's convenient about a walled city, though, is that as long as you walk straight, you'll eventually find a wall. Which is exactly what we did, and, like the night before, we couldn't have planned it any better.

"This is amazing," Michelle said. We had "navigated" to one of the end points of Las Murallas, where the wall overlooks Avenue Venezuela, the main thoroughfare into the Old Town. Even with all the historical attractions concentrated in this part of Cartagena, it's very much a working sector of the city, so at 8:30 in the morning, the masses are commuting into El Centro and San Diego. As Michelle noted, "There are scooters and buses and taxis galore."

So many vacation destinations are measured in terms of tranquility. Noted for providing the opportunity to escape the real world. That's not Cartagena's game. Here you're thrust *into* the real world, among business people going to their offices, kids going to school, merchants pushing massive carts of fruit, and generous bartenders who keep a personal supply of aguardiente at the ready. And as Michelle said, it really can be amazing to feel a part of such a lively community, even if only for a few days.

A Walk On The Wall

We stood atop the city wall at the northernmost corner of Old Town. Here the bulwark thickens, and we discovered an exercise group making use of the wide, flat surface — with a prime, sun-facing position — for a morning yoga session. Directly below this section is Las Bóvedas, a collection of 23 narrow chambers that over the centuries have served as military storerooms and a dungeon, and are now occupied by various souvenir shops.

"Why don't we just stay up here and start walking," I suggested. So we headed south, stopping for photos in front of different lookouts and with a battery of cannons that are still in place. The wall doesn't necessarily provide a bird's-eye view of the city, but the elevated perspective is pretty tough to beat, especially from the long segment that hugs the coastline, creating a juxtaposed spectacle of wide open Caribbean Sea in one direction and bustling urban core to the other.

When we arrived at the end of Las Murallas, it was early afternoon, and time for some food. "I definitely want to try El Burlador de Sevilla tonight," Michelle said. "Their paella is supposed to be very good. [It is.] Let's just have some snacks now."

Perfect. A midday snack in Cartagena often equals street food, and I'm a big fan. Fruit sellers roam the city throughout the day. And you can't miss them: The women wear bright colors and balance big bowls of fresh produce on their heads (top right), and the gentlemen typically push carts with all the fixings for a quick smoothie. Other vendors can usually be found where locals tend to gather: parks,



transportation hubs, and outside major stores.

I stood in line for grilled *chorizo* sausage on a stick and a cheese empanada while Michelle walked across the way and bought a fruit salad with bananas, pineapples, and about three other varieties we could neither recognize nor pronounce.

Food in hand, we started to mosey back through the heart of El Centro. Similar to the French Quarter in New Orleans, there's no block here that's not worth seeing at least once. Sure, they might not all have shops or attractions, but the architecture and ambiance alone is worth the walk. We made a point to occasionally change course — a left here, another left up there, then a right — in ways we knew weren't the "correct" direction, but we wanted to see as much as possible.

One moment we were marveling at a stretch of colonial buildings so bright, they seemed to have been painted their respective reds and blues and yellows just yesterday, and the next we were deep in a quiet residential district where green and pink bougainvillea climbed the houses' white walls.

Magical Reality

According to local lore, Gabriel García Márquez penned at least a portion of his Love in the Time of Cholera while sitting at some of

the same rickety tables Michelle and I discovered our first evening in town. Who knows. I'm a Márquez fan though, so I tend to believe it, just like I believe in the magical happenings of his novels and short stories. To call Cartagena itself magical is cliché at this point. Still, while I won't claim to have seen any ghosts or levitating maidens or old men with enormous wings during our week in town, I won't say any of that would have surprised me either.

After sunset on our final night, we headed toward Plaza Fernández de Madrid and the nameless restaurants and bar adjacent to it. Michelle wanted a pizza; I was in the mood for a steak. And we were both thirsty for an Aguila. (If you must know, we visited this specific stretch of sidewalk at least once every day.) But when we arrived, there was a car parked where "our" table should have been. We were heartbroken. Alfredo waved hello, and then recognized the problem. "Un momento," he said, and proceeded to the corner.

"Is he really doing what I think he's doing?" I said to Michelle.

A shrill whistle, followed by a rush of Spanish chatter, split the calm evening for a few seconds before a young man came jogging across the street. He nodded to us, and then pulled away in his car.

"Yes, he is," Michelle said, eyebrows raised watching the scene unfold.

Alfredo lifted our table out to the street and pulled up two chairs. The hallmark of Márquez's best writing is that, to his characters, the most extraordinary events that take place in the story are as normal as any other everyday occurrence. After Alfredo put our table down, he looked at us as if nothing out of the ordinary had just happened — and then he poured a round of aguardiente. It might not have been magic per se, but in all my years of traveling, I've yet to experience many moments more magical than that one.



hen you think of Atlantic City, New Jersey, family fun is probably not the first thing that pops into your mind. But when it comes to sand, Skee-Ball, and saltwater taffy, Atlantic City (affectionately known as AC) is one of the top locations to visit for a true Jersey Shore family experience. Whether you're looking for beach time, animal encounters, or exceptional dining and shopping, our five-day itinerary packs in excite-

ment and leaves plenty of time for relaxation.

Day 1: The World's Most Famous Boardwalk

Begin your visit in the center of the action: the Atlantic City boardwalk. Built in 1870, America's first boardwalk is the best place to experience AC's vibe. Start at Steel Pier, which recently underwent a \$23 million renovation (open seasonally; check steelpier.com for hours). With rides ranging from the timeless double-decker carousel to the extreme SlingShot (shooting you 225 feet into the air in 1.5 seconds), there's something for everyone at this classic pier amusement park. Games are also available, but save your quarters for the Central Pier Arcade & Speedway, which offers all varieties of arcade games and a go-kart track. It's the perfect place for families to get a PG-rated casino experience, playing slot machines for tickets redeemable at the huge prize center.

Continuing up the boardwalk, duck into Haunted Tales or Ripley's Believe It or Not if you're into attractions that tend toward the creepy. Either can take under an hour and leave you with lasting — if not bizarre memories. Next, put on your international spy hat and try Ripley's Laser Maze Challenge. Who hasn't always wanted to navigate a web of lasers, just like in the movies?

The boardwalk can be overstimulating, so be sure to take a walk on the beach. AC beaches are free to access, and there are multiple walkways connecting the boardwalk to the shore.

By now you're tired and hungry. Rest your feet and take a rolling chair a classic AC experience where you are pushed in a wheeled cart up the wooden boardwalk — to Rainforest Cafe. It's literally a rain forest inside, complete with animatronic gorillas, exotic fish, and simulated thunder and lightning that strikes every few minutes. My 10-year-old daughter, Cassie, and I were seated right next to a large aquarium and made friends with a puffer fish, who seemed to stare at us through our entire meal.

Skip dessert at Rainforest Cafe, and cross the boardwalk to It'Sugar at The Pier Shops at Caesars, where your family will be in candy heaven. Once the kids are sugared up, take them to the second level of The Pier Shops for a round or two of GlowGolf — indoor minigolf in the dark — or head back out to the boardwalk for classic outdoor minigolf just a few steps away. Better yet, have dad or grandpa take them golfing while the other adults browse the shops. I loved Lush for its unique, all-natural bath and body products — I brought home a few sweet-smelling bath bombs.

End your day on the boardwalk with the free 3-D light and sound show projected onto the front of Boardwalk Hall (right next to the minigolf course). Beginning at 6:00 p.m. and running every half hour, the eight-and-a-halfminute show reflects the personality of Atlantic City through surround sound, theatrical lighting, and architectural video mapping.



Day 2: Marine Merriment

Start your day at Gilchrist Restaurant in Historic Gardner's Basin, tucked away from the hubbub of the boardwalk, along Atlantic City's back bay. This unassuming waterfront eatery might not look like much on the outside, but the thin, crepe-like blueberry hotcakes are the talk of the town. Family-owned and in business since 1946, Gilchrist is well-known for its satisfying breakfasts and energetic service.

After breakfast, browse the eclectic boutiques in Crafters Village (open seasonally). You'll find dolls, jewelry, water-sports gear, an art gallery, and more. The tiny shops resemble backyard sheds — all part of the charm.

The Atlantic City Aquarium, also part of Gardner's Basin, lets you get up close and personal with stingrays, starfish, and tropical sharks in touch pools. This quaint spot might only take you an hour to tour, unless you have a daughter like mine who just can't pull herself away from her conversations with fish, rays, and lizards. She also thrilled at seeing baby sharks and shark eggs in the touch pool.

When you depart from the aquarium, grab a quick lunch at Back Bay Ale House, and get ready for more adventure out on the open sea. Atlantic City Cruises offers dolphin-watching cruises through mid-October, leaving from Gardner's Basin. You can also try parasailing, fish the calm waters of Atlantic City's back bay in a pontoon boat, and book a deep-sea fishing excursion and bring back your own catch of the day.

Day 3: Elephants, Fries, and Diamonds — Oh My!

I have fond memories of my family's Sunday drives. Even on vacation, my dad would always take time to drive around and observe. Whether I realized it or not, I was taking in details about architecture, culture, food, nature, and history. I still love a meandering, scenic drive, and the Jersey Shore provides an outstanding opportunity with a trip along Ocean Drive. Connecting Atlantic City to Cape May — the southernmost tip of New Jersey — the drive takes you along the barrier islands on the Atlantic Ocean and offers spectacular views, iconic landmarks, and plenty of culinary delights.

Start out on Atlantic Avenue in Atlantic City, and make your way down to Margate to visit Lucy the Elephant. A New Jersey legend, Lucy is six stories high and a National Historic Landmark. A short tour teaches you about Lucy's history and grants access to the *howdah* (the platform atop her back) via a spiral staircase for glorious views of the ocean.


Philly Foray

No trip to the Atlantic City area would be complete without a diversion to the historic city of Philadelphia. Just over an hour's drive from Atlantic City, Philly welcomes shoppers, foodies, and history buffs alike with iconic attractions such as the Liberty Bell, Independence Hall, Reading Terminal Market, and The Franklin Institute.

Fans of the movie *Rocky* will find an impressive photo opp on the "Rocky Steps" at the Philadelphia Museum of Art. Bound up the stairs, and snap a pic of your best triumphant pose. If you're inspired to get even more exercise, Philly has a plethora of walking tours: ghost, food, cocktails, history, and even a Quintessential Rocky Tour of Philadelphia, during which you'll visit landmarks from the movie series.

Continuing south, you'll pass through Ocean City, Avalon, and Wildwood, marveling at the beautiful homes, boardwalks, amusements, and food, and passing over bridges offering stunning scenery. When you get hungry for a snack, I highly recommend a stop at Curley's Fries, located at Morey's Piers in Wildwood. You can watch the fries being made, and then buy yourself a bucket. Don't worry about finishing them — they are the best fries you'll ever taste. Curley's is on the Wildwood boardwalk — another Jersey Shore institution.

Hop back in the car, and complete your drive to Sunset Beach in Cape May. Enjoy dinner at The Grille, and let the kids dig on the beach for Cape May Diamonds — quartz crystals that the Kechemeche Indians believed possessed supernatural power to bring success and good fortune. Head back to AC via the Garden State Parkway, about a 50-minute drive.





The Absecon Lighthouse is the tallest lighthouse in New Jersey, yet dwarfed by the nearby casino hotels. Still, experiencing this little piece of history protected among the high-rises is worth the 228-step climb. You'll learn about shipwrecks and tidewater in the replicated 1925 Keeper's House and history museum. The view from the top is beautiful, and the gift shop is simply adorable.

Next, head downtown. The Sheraton Atlantic City Convention Center Hotel's self-guided Road to the Crown Walking Tour highlights the history of the Miss America pageant, first held in AC in 1921. The tour begins in the Sheraton lobby with Miss America dresses, a historical video, and memorabilia on display. Continue upstairs to the Shoe Bar, which showcases contestants' shoes from previous pageants, then outside and down the block to the Miss America Rose Walk through the Tanger Outlets. The Rose Walk tells the story of the Miss America pageant through commemorative bronze plaques, and it continues right down to the boardwalk. On your way, get a little shopping in at the outlets, which includes stores such as Coach, Crocs, Old Navy, Carter's, Aerosoles, and Skechers.

Just a block from the Tanger Outlets is The Noyes Arts Garage Stockton College. Visitors can watch artists at work in their studio spaces, creating with various mediums such as photography,



painting, pastels, basket weaving, and more. Admission is free, and you can ask the artists questions and purchase original artwork.

Continuing down to the boardwalk, you'll encounter a plethora of restaurants. Choose from prime beef at Morton's, fondue at The Melting Pot, and many more options. And don't forget to try some famous boardwalk taffy at James' Candy Company. In business since the 1880s, James' offers more than 30 flavors of its beloved candy in vintage-style packaging.



Day 5: Picnic at the Zoo



ituated along the southeastern edge of its namesake body of water, Georgian Bay Islands National Park comprises 63 separate landmasses. Some aren't much more than uninhabitable outcroppings barely peaking above the waves. Others, though, with their wind-weary pine forests, dreamy rock formations, and tranquil sand beaches, offer what seems like a full continent's worth of unspoiled natural splendor. Beausoleil Island, the largest — and one of the most popular — of the preserve's destinations, is one of those, and is easily accessible via the *DayTripper* ferry from Honey Harbour on Ontario's mainland. Once there, scenic hikes and panoramic bike rides are the principal activities, especially from late September through early October when the landscape is highlighted by a grand display of the turning fall foliage.
