Hail to the Chef

They're on TV every week, demanding more caramelization on the *mirepoix* and less reduction on the rosemary-balsamic marinade. As judges for reality cooking competition shows, celebrity chefs entertain audiences with their critiques (and clever insults) while they challenge contestants in a professional kitchen. Their words carry weight. Many are already household names in the culinary world after years of honing their flawless techniques. And as the world's fascination with celebrity chefs skyrockets, one can't help but wonder what it would be like to savor one of their ingenious and carefully crafted recipes.

Here, we've rounded up our top celebrity chef restaurant picks in Interval resort vacation destinations. Having an exceptional meal created by your favorite as-seen-on-TV food genius can be as simple as calling ahead to reserve a table when planning your next trip.

MIAMI, FLORIDA

JOSÉ ANDRÉS: BAZAAR MAR

Famous for his inventive dishes using a technique called spherification (reshaping liquid into a semi-solidified sphere), the Spanish-American chef is widely recognized for bringing the small plates-dining concept to the U.S. Andrés owns



a group of 26 restaurants around the world, including **Bazaar Mar**, which opened within the SLS Brickell Hotel & Residences at the end of 2016. Seafood takes center stage here, from the name and menu to the decor itself. The blue and white dining room is like a mythical seascape: A giant fish-head sculpture with horns is mounted behind the bar, tiles are decorated with designs depicting mermaids and half-lobster people, and golden crabs appear to crawl up the walls.

As Seen on TV: Made in Spain, Iron Chef America, Top Chef Must Try: At Bazaar Mar, every plate is presented with a whimsical, sea-themed twist. Take the California "funnel cake," for example: a thin seaweed wafer topped with avocado, blue crab, tobiko (roe), mayo, and cucumber served on a silver octopus-shaped stand. Tapas are also featured, and include Maine lobster croquetas and the world-famous marinated "Ferran Adrià" liquid olives (if you want to see what spherification is first-hand). For dessert, order the Key lime pie "our way" — Key lime ice cream with a graham-cracker crumble in the shape of a sand castle, served with a lime foam.

SCOTT CONANT: SCARPETTA

Establishing himself as a chef by working in popular Manhattan Italian kitchens for nearly 30 years, the finicky TV judge eventually opened his own restaurants, which have consistently earned starred reviews and awards. One of his well-known outposts is **Scarpetta**, at the Fontainebleau Miami



Beach hotel. Although Conant's menu items sound simple, his intricate cooking methods bring bold flavors out of the most basic ingredients. For one, he makes his pastas from scratch daily, and seasons them with herb-infused oils. And he doesn't cook them completely in boiling water — he finishes off by transferring them al dente to a pan of sauce, adjusting its thickness by adding pasta water from the pot.

As Seen on TV: Chopped, Top Chef

Must Try: Conant's creamy polenta is silky smooth and served with a fricassee of truffled mushrooms. His spaghetti with tomato and basil is a standout dish for the chef, who takes a meticulous approach to preparing a sauce that involves boiling, peeling, and deseeding fresh plum tomatoes before mashing them.

LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

GIADA DE LAURENTIIS: GIADA

This Food Network darling is best known for her laid-back charm, and always looking glamorous in the kitchen. Her shows and cookbooks pay homage to her Italian roots, as she demonstrates how to whip up easy-to-make versions of old family recipes. Although her cooking existed only in the TV

realm for many years, the Emmy Award–winning celebrity chef opened her first restaurant, **Giada**, inside The Cromwell hotel in 2014.

As Seen on TV: Giada at Home, Everyday Italian, Food Network Star, Iron Chef America

Must Try: Giada features Italian cuisine with California influences, bringing a lighter touch to classic dishes by incorporating vegetables or healthy ingredients (plenty of greens, herbs, and citrus). De Laurentiis' classics, such as her chicken cacciatore and rigatoni with vegetable Bolognese, are on the menu. One of the most popular plates is lemon spaghetti with shrimp and basil. The sauce is made by whisking together olive oil, Parmesan cheese, and lemon zest and juice. The dish is garnished with fried capers.

GORDON RAMSAY: HELL'S KITCHEN

TV's favorite explosive, foul-mouthed chef opened his newest restaurant **Hell's Kitchen**, the first-of-its-kind, at Caesars Palace this past winter. Inspired by Ramsay's high-stakes cooking competition show, the interior is designed in blue and red team sections, with the two busy kitchens as the centerpiece. Guests are smack in the middle



of the action, as if participating on the show, and get to try the chef's recipes from the TV series, as well as some of Ramsay's specialties, such as crispy skin salmon and beef Wellington.

As Seen on TV: Hell's Kitchen, MasterChef, MasterChef Junior, Kitchen Nightmares

Must Try: Steak lovers *have* to order the beef Wellington, a traditional British dish made with seared filet mignon covered with Parma ham and duxelles (a mushroom paste), and baked inside a puff pastry. It's served sliced in half and accompanied with a red wine demiglace. For something sweet, Ramsay's sticky toffee pudding with ice cream is legendary.

NEW YORK CITY, NEW YORK

ALEX GUARNASCHELLI: BUTTER

You could say cooking was this Iron Chef's destiny: The daughter of a cookbook author, Guarnaschelli grew up kneading bread and tasting soufflés in her home kitchen. The classically trained chef worked in prestigious restaurants in New York and Paris before becoming the executive chef at **Butter**, located in midtown Manhattan. The upscale eat-



ery features seasonal dishes, inspired by ingredients Guarnaschelli finds at Union Square Greenmarket.

As Seen on TV: Iron Chef America, The Next Iron Chef, Chopped, Alex's Day Off

Must Try: Butter serves a varied menu, from roasted Mexican street corn and avocado toast burrata to poached shrimp and steak tartare. One of the restaurant's signature desserts is raspberry beignets with a vanilla bean dipping sauce.

ANNE BURRELL: PHIL & ANNE'S GOOD TIME LOUNGE

The feisty, spiky-haired chef worked in restaurants in New York and Italy before her breakout Food Network appearance cooking as a sous-chef on *Iron Chef America*. Since then, she's been a network staple, hosting several hit shows and using her years of industry experience to inspire home cooks to become kitchen rock stars. And now, she's putting her food out there, with the opening of her own establishment in Brooklyn. The Mediterranean-Italian

style restaurant and bar is a joint venture between Burrell and New York bar owner Phil Casaceli. The funky neighborhood hotspot, with metallic orange wallpaper and bright-green tufted banquettes, serves cocktails crafted by Casaceli and appetizer-sized dishes developed by Burrell.

NAPA, CALIFORNIA

MASAHARU MORIMOTO: MORIMOTO NAPA

The Iron Chef of Iron Chefs, Morimoto was one of the kitchen stadium's original resident chefs when Iron Chef America, a spinoff of a Japanese TV show, was launched. Off-screen, Morimoto worked at some of Manhattan's prestigious restaurants, including as head chef at Nobu, before opening his own eponymous eateries. His Napa outpost introduced the chef's signature

high-end sushi and Japanese-fusion dishes (tuna pizza, anyone?) to the West Coast in 2010. The restaurant has an outdoor dining terrace overlooking the Napa River, and the area's only sake and Japanese whisky bar.

As Seen on TV: Iron Chef, Iron Chef America, The Next Iron Chef Must Try: The contemporary Japanese menu includes just about everything, from pork, duck, and beef to fresh seafood and sushi. Try one of the more unique selections at Morimoto Napa, like sea urchin carbonara or duck meatball soup, or stick to one of the most popular offerings: toro (tuna belly) tartare, served on a washboard with a little rake and pads of wasabi, nori paste, sour cream, and sturgeon caviar.

CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

RICK BAYLESS: FRONTERA GRILL AND TOPOLOBAMPO

The Oklahoma native began to specialize in authentic Mexican cuisine after living in Mexico with his wife while researching their first cookbook in the 1980s. When they returned to the U.S., the couple wanted to open a restaurant reminiscent of their travels. And so, in 1987, they founded the casual **Frontera Grill**, with colorful Mexican folk art



hanging on the walls and mariachi music resonating in the dining room. Shortly after, Bayless and his wife opened the more upscale **Topolobampo** right next door, in the River North neighborhood. The side-by-side eateries share an entrance, but Topolobampo's menu is more inventive and refined than its sister establishment.

As Seen on TV: Mexico: One Plate at a Time, Iron Chef America, Top Chef Masters

On the Menu: Frontera Grill highlights authentic dishes and flavors — from ceviche and enchiladas to moles and tacos — made with fresh ingredients from local farms (they even list their sources on the menu). At Topolobampo, guests can choose between three tasting options (two five-course and one seven-course). The items — such as rabbit with a sauce made from the fermented Mexican beverage *pulque*,



tastes, textures, and sauces.

ART SMITH: BLUE DOOR KITCHEN & GARDEN

Art Smith spent much of his career cooking as the personal chef to Oprah Winfrey and two Florida governors before starting his

own Southern-themed restaurants. His appearances on TV shows and numerous food festivals around the world also launched him into superstardom. Although his fried chicken made him famous, Smith decided to shift the focus from Southern comfort food to a farm-to-table concept at his Gold Coast restaurant, which reflects Smith's own lifestyle changes to improve his health over the past few years.

As Seen on TV: Iron Chef America, Top Chef, Top Chef Masters, Chopped

Must Try: Seasonal ingredients dictate the menu at Blue Door Kitchen

& Garden, and popular options include the Brussels sprouts and kale salad, with toasted almonds, Parmesan cheese, bacon, and maple tahini vinaigrette; and the organic salmon served with rutabaga latkes, Brussels sprouts, creme fraiche, and apples. Two of Smith's specialty dishes are a nod to his old favorites: buttermilk fried chicken with garlic mashed potatoes, and shrimp and grits with andouille sausage and tomato stew. ■

Flea markets have been around for hundreds of years, beckoning bargain hunters and collectors from cities (and even states) away with great deals on a range of one-of-a-kind items. Whether you enjoy the haggle, need a souvenir from your travels, or just want to walk down memory lane, the market has you covered.

These fleas are filled with new, old, homemade, and handcrafted finds. Entertainment — performances, demonstrations, activities — takes place at some, concessions and fresh produce are available at most, and all are within a one-hour drive of resorts in Interval's network. So grab some cash, lace up your walking shoes, and set out to score some steals.

DAYTONA FLEA & FARMERS MARKET

Stray from the seashore to stroll among the 1,000-plus booths at the Daytona Flea & Farmers Market, Florida's extensive indoor/outdoor market, which draws more than 2.5 million visitors every year. The selection does not fall short at this attraction, featuring a smorgasbord of items including tires, vacuums, live plants, handmade soaps, and leather apparel. The nearest strand is just a few miles away, so take the opportunity to stock up on the necessary beach gear, such as chairs, pail and shovel sets, coolers, and towels.

When Friday comes, locals and out-of-towners hit the booths for some haggling. While produce is a guarantee, you never know what merchandise you'll find, but you'll likely stumble across baseball cards, ornaments, used board games, wall art, and electronics. The early bird gets the worm here, so arrive in the morning if you want your pick of the litter. And if you're feeling nostalgic, don't hesitate to take a spin on the on-site carousel.

From tools and sporting equipment to delicious baked goods and collectors' items, each booth is worth a browse. That is, if you can manage to see it all in one day; this market is one of the largest and most visited in the state. Expect to find homemade candies and jams, cowboy boots and engraved leather goods, and a plethora of handy kitchen gadgets. Free entertainment and Wi-Fi is available, and the Liquidation Outlet offers discounts on already low-priced items.

ALEMANY FLEA MARKET

You'll spy housewares, vinyl records, statuary, toys, clothing, tools — and the list goes on. For the best deals, plan to arrive in the afternoon or be willing to hang around. End-of-day bargains are worth the wait here, especially on larger items.

TANQUE VERDE SWAP MEET



That's when you remember the hometown listed on the nametag of the great Disney cast member who helped you find the perfect souvenir at Epcot: Orlando, FL.

> Indeed, Orlando is a real place! With real, live, non-Imagineered people! So where do the locals go for fun? you wonder.

> "Orlando is more than just the home of the Mouse," says Ricky Ly, author of the Food Lovers' Guide to Orlando. "It's also home to many eclectic neighborhoods — each with its own culture and flavors. You could stroll along Winter Park's Park Avenue and dine on French macarons and croissants, or visit the Mills 50 area, home of the largest Vietnamese business district in Florida, and enjoy a delicious bowl of pho [beef noodle soup]. The diversity is what makes Orlando special."

> Thanks in part to that diversity, Orlando's "Main Street" neighborhoods are thriving. In recent years, so many new businesses have sprung up - restaurants in particular — that the city has been receiving all kinds of foodie accolades, from write-ups in The New York Times, to being voted one of the

Orlando's actual neighborhoods are not only ripe for exploration, they're packed with genuinely delicious options some of which are sold by the pint.

Best Foodie Cities in America by WalletHub.com, to multiple visits by various Food Network stars — Alton Brown and Guy Fieri, to name a couple — looking for great places to profile.

And independent food artisans know that Orlando's local 'hoods are where it's at. So if you're looking to take a pass on your FastPasses for a day in order to get to know the city on a more personal level, here are a few districts (and dishes) to check out.

AUDUBON PARK GARDEN DISTRICT TAKES THE CAKE

This eco-minded community is home to **East End Market**, a collection of local merchants offering fine foods, phenomenal home goods, and loads of knowledge to those seeking to adopt a more farm-to-table lifestyle. Coming for dinner? **Domu** serves up some of the best ramen in the city, along with Asian small plates and exceptional cocktails in a modern, inviting space.

The **Olde Hearth Bread Co.** and **Gideon's Bakehouse** also are located at East End Market. The former is a purveyor of all manner of breads, rolls, tarts, and granola; the latter is a cookie-lover's mecca. Gideon's cookies (and cakes), inspired by recipes that date back to the late 1800s, are truly timeless — and delightfully chocolate chip—encrusted.

Across the street, the **Blue Bird Bake Shop** beckons with its award-winning cupcakes in eight everyday flavors and a host of varieties that branch out. Way out. On any given visit you might find options in Kahlúa and cream, coffee toffee, or strawberry balsamic. A few doors over, you'll find **P is for Pie Bake Shop**, where from-scratch pies come in traditional tins, hand pies, glass jars, and even pie pops.

The Gourmet Muffin is one of this neighborhood's newest additions. Here, the proprietor makes all kinds of muffins, along with cannoli, brownies, bread pudding, and a unique muffin-croissant hybrid known as the "cruffin."

ART IS EVERYWHERE: MILLS 50

Art abounds in Mills 50, so much so that aside from the many beautiful murals gracing the building facades, you'll find it on the electrical boxes, on the sewer drains, and yes, even on the dumpsters. The neighborhood's various urban-art projects have made the scenery around Mills 50, which bills itself as "the intersection of creativity and culture," as colorful as the dishes served at its many independent eateries.

But let's start with the name: Mills 50. That's actually the intersection where Mills Avenue meets Colonial

Drive (also known as State Road 50). It's about a mile north of downtown and just south of the city's museum zone, where various hubs of science and art draw culture seekers in droves.

It's also an intersection of Asian influences. Orlando has a large Vietnamese community, and visitors would be remiss not to try one or more of the authentic restaurants concentrated here. **Pho 88** and **Anh Hong** are no-lose propositions, but they're hardly the only games in town. There are Chinese, Japanese, Korean, and Thai eateries, too.

Only have time for one? Consider **Hawkers Asian Street Fare**. True to its name, the small plates are inspired by the street hawkers found in Malaysia, China, Korea, Singapore, Vietnam, and Thailand.

"What started as a forgotten neighborhood on the edge of downtown has blossomed, over the [past] five years, into the epicenter for eclectic eateries and entertainment in Orlando," Kaleb Harrell, co-founder of Hawkers, says of Mills 50.

"I tell all my friends from out of town that when they get tired of the parks, to make the 20-minute drive to Mills 50 to explore Asian eats, and some of the coolest bars and shops Orlando has to offer!"

If you're headed to the Orlando Science Center — or any of its adjacent museums — Mills 50 also is the place to wet your whistle after a day of enlightenment. Stop by **BART** for a craft beer and to play the video games you remember from the '80s, or have an expertly poured cocktail at **The Guesthouse**.

SMALL TOWN CHARM AND SUDS IN SANFORD

Northeast of Orlando lies the town of Sanford. It retains its small-town charm in part because it retains its town. The brick-lined streets and buildings are authentic, and the phenomenal residential architecture that surrounds it only bolsters the sleepy, but increasingly hip, vibe. Sanford, for years on the upswing, has definitely arrived. It was voted Best Kept Secret in *Orlando Weekly*'s 2016 Best of Orlando issue.

"Orlando has world-class attractions. It's why more than 65 million people each year come here," says Dan Ping, founder of The Bokey, a blog about Sanford and Seminole County. "But it's much

more than that. When you visit Sanford or other Main Street neighborhoods, what you find is a community that embraces the culture of craft when it comes to food, drink, arts, entertainment, and shopping. You're also visiting a town that is truly historic, not make-believe."

Ping isn't knocking the parks. In fact, a successful visit to any of them only serves to make his point. What they do is expertly manufactured. What Sanford offers is 100-percent real and local.

It's one of the many reasons Anne McNamara and Brad Plummer chose to open their restaurant, **The District**, right in the heart of Sanford.

"We liked the neighborhood and wanted to be part of the revival," says Plummer. "Being one of the oldest cities in Central Florida, it has that charm and the people are great! They're wonderful

It's Crafty

Whether you spend your time at the parks, power shopping, or simply soaking up the abundant sunshine, there's no doubt you're going to work up a thirst. Not to worry. Central Florida's microbrew scene is beginning to rival Tampa's. And Orlando's local brewers are not only a convivial bunch, they're collaborative.

"We were always recommending other breweries for our customers to check out," says Mike Wallace, co-owner of **Ten10 Brewing Company**, a cool Mills 50 taproom. And so he and several other area brewers got together to help create the Central Florida Ale Trail.

"It's not a new idea," he continues. "A lot of other cities do it and, with all the breweries opening, we thought it would be a great idea so that people could eventually visit all the local places."

The map — available at Ten10 and all the other participating stops — reps the region with retro-postcard appeal, and dou-

bles as a stampable "passport." Hit up the establishment, get your map stamped, and if you manage to finish, you'll be rewarded with a special growler to mark the accomplishment. If not, the map itself is a neat souvenir, and you'll have sampled some great local beer.

Ten10 is within easy walking distance of the aforementioned Hawkers Asian Street Fare. In the Audubon Park Garden District. **Redlight Redlight Beer Parlour** and Brewery began its life as a craft beer bar, and expanded to include its own specialty sours and wild beers a few years ago. Up in Sanford, the list keeps growing. Ale Trail breweries include Sanford Brewing Company. where dogs are not only welcome, they're offered homemade treats made from the brewery's own spent grains, and Wop's Hops Brewing Company, with fun brews such as the Hail Caesar and Smokin' Hot Italian that keep beer lovers coming back



and courteous and kind, and it's very much a community here in Sanford."

The District opened in spring 2017, and its scratch-made America-inspired fare has been winning over diners in the months since, with hearty dishes such as bourbon bone-in pork chops and classic shrimp and grits. The bar does well, too. Locals amble in and wash the day away with their choice of more than a dozen beers on tap — including a few brewed in the area — and six signature cocktails.

As for shopping, Sanford has long been known as an antiquing town (and to some degree, it still is), but these days, shoppers

have far more to peruse than dusty racks. **Washburn Imports** features breathtaking home furnishings from exotic, far-flung corners (plus, there's a cool wine and cocktail bar inside). **Magpies Modern General Store** sells gifts of all sorts, from jewelry to home goods to delicious artisan popsicles that'll keep you cool while strolling about. And an abundance of little galleries offer one-of-a-kind items unlike anything you'll find in the resort zone.


Speaking of one of a kind, how about some gourmet marshmallows? You'll find them at **Wondermade**, where friendly workers will fire 'em up special for fresh s'mores, or you can just buy a box for later — maybe the birthday cake or gold Champagne flavors — while you enjoy the homemade ice cream.

Of course, as is the case with other area neighborhoods, Sanford boasts a mix of culinary — and entertainment — choices, some of which are quintessentially American and others that are decidedly not.

"A five-minute walk in any direction in downtown [Sanford] will lead to multiple food options: Greek, German, Jamaican, Korean, American, seafood, gastropubs, barbecue, gourmet ice cream, diners, and bar grub," Ping rattles off. "We have breweries, craft cocktail bars, a handful of juke joints, and [**The Alley**], the best place to see live blues music in Central Florida."

And the coolest part? In the Main Street neighborhoods of Orlando, that's all just the beginning. ■

For history buffs, there's no place like Greater Williamsburg in Virginia. With a triangle of world-class living history museums and the second-oldest college in the country, it's hard to beat this destination for lively lessons in the country's Colonial past. But 1607 (when the first permanent English settlement in North America was established in Jamestown) was just the beginning of the area's appeal to travelers. Today, amusement parks, wineries, golf courses, art galleries, dining, and more compete for visitors' attention. To winnow out the best, four insiders help identify not-to-be-missed experiences.



LAND'S END and BEYOND

Teeming with marine life, the waters around

Cabo, Mexico,

offer leisure pursuits aplenty.

Forming the spine of Baja California Sur state, the Sierra de la Laguna mountain range dominates the center of the peninsula between La Paz, the state capital, and Los Cabos, the state's most popular travel destination. These mountains reach nearly as high as 7,000 feet before descending on all sides into desert. The stark landscapes are guarded by lonely sentinels and towering specimens of cardón, the world's largest cactus species. To the south, east, and west, the desert slowly shifts as it nears the coast, its coarse-grained, gravelly sand gradually becoming — like coal into diamonds — the fine golden powder of Cabo's picturesque beaches. It truly is a stunning geographical transformation, from rocky pinnacles to sunbaked desert to wave-lapped shorelines, all in the space of a few short miles.

But as captivating as this strange and beautiful area is, virtually everyone agrees that the region's most spectacular natural features lie just beyond its Land's End promontory, where sparkling azure waters fan out from the peninsula's southern tip.

MARLIN CAPITAL OF THE WORLD

Cabo San Lucas' tourism industry was built on fishing. During the first half of the 20th century, when the town's population numbered about 300 people, its cannery was one of the most productive in Latin America. By the 1960s, resorts were popping up along the coastline between Cabo San Lucas and San José del Cabo, soon to be the twin hubs of the Los Cabos municipality. There was no highway at the time, and little in the way of service and amenities, but fishermen heard the rumors about big catches and soon arrived.

The area's overwhelming abundance of billfish, marlin in particular, has earned Cabo San Lucas its nickname, The Marlin Capital of the World, and birthed both a fishing fleet and a host of high-profile fishing tournaments. The most famous of these competitions by far is Bisbee's Black & Blue — aka the Super Bowl of Sport Fishing which takes place in October and has been turning fishermen into millionaires for over three decades. The tournament's 2006 cash payout

of more than \$4 million remains the largest in sport fishing history.

Conservation efforts and catch-andrelease policies have kept the Cabo San Lucas fishing industry strong, and today, visiting anglers can still strap themselves into a fighting chair on the aft deck of a cabin cruiser and battle marlin, sailfish, and tuna the size of small cars. What has changed are the variety of charter options and the introduction of some rather posh amenities.

Blue Sky Cabo, for example, offers ground transportation (including limousine upgrades) for guests, a fishing fleet that

includes an elegantly appointed 60-foot Bertram yacht, and VIP extras that range from mixology to meal service. Blue Sky also welcomes women, a shift in marketing focus that's on the rise in Cabo's traditionally male-dominated fishing industry. During the summer of 2017, a tournament exclusively for women, the Señoritas Blue Water Classic, premiered on the Los Cabos municipality's beautiful East Cape.

FEROCIOUS WITH LIFE

Nobel Prize-winning novelist John Steinbeck, on a specimencollection expedition in 1940 with marine biologist friend Ed Ricketts the inspiration for the character Doc in Cannery Row — memorably described the Sea of Cortez as "ferocious with life." It's an apt description for a body of water with some 875 species of fish, and myriad other forms of marine life.

On the East Cape, the offshore government-protected sanctuary of Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park boasts the single-highest concentration of fish in this remarkable sea and, as such, is the region's premier snorkeling and scuba diving site. Cabo San Lucas companies Cabo Adventures and Cabo Expeditions both offer regularly scheduled dive trips to the marine sanctuary, which also claims one of the

oldest and largest living coral reefs in the Western Hemisphere.

Cabo San Lucas-based tour operators more commonly offer snorkel trips to pristine sites in the Chileno and Santa María bays. which are located much closer to Land's End, along the corridor that connects the cape cities. Land's End itself is also a snorkel and dive destination of note, thanks to an upwelling effect from the confluence of the Sea of Cortez and Pacific Ocean that produces particularly fishfriendly conditions at sites like Pelican Rock and The Point.

In 2014, Hurricane Odile uncovered a previously buried shipwreck near Land's End, the S.S. Harry Lundeberg, a cargo ship that sailed to its doom in 1954, adding a newly formed artificial reef to the list of spectacular dive sites.

THE BIGGEST CREATURES IN THE SEA

Los Cabos is famous for its whale-watching. Every year, 5,000 to 10,000 whales leave their arctic feeding grounds for winter in warmer waters, while females birth calves in shallow-water inlets and coves around Baja California Sur. Humpbacks and grays are the most frequently sighted whales, but fin and sperm whales, and even orcas and blue whales (the largest mammal ever to have lived on earth), can occasionally be spied from local resorts, golf courses, and tour boats.

And whales aren't the only leviathans cruising the local waters. Whale sharks, the largest fish in the world — which reach up to 40 feet in length, and weigh as much as 47,000 pounds — also enjoy the temperate conditions, typically taking up residence around La Paz between the months of August and May. Vacationers can swim with these gentle giants, that subsist solely on plankton. Round-trip transportation from Los Cabos is provided by several well-respected operators, including Cabo Adventures and Cabo Expeditions.

RED SAILS AT SUNSET

Known for excellent sailing beyond its protected bay, Cabo San Lucas hosted the 2017 finals of the Extreme Sailing Series, a global racing competition between high-tech, carbon fiber yachts capable of speeds in excess of 40 miles per hour.

More leisurely excursions are available from a variety of local companies, including Cabo Sails and Cabo Sailing, both of which feature romantic sunset cruises. Cabo Adventures offers the most upscale tours in the area, luxurious day-trip sails aboard its splendidly outfitted French-built yachts. Guests cruise the coast, then drop anchor in a protected cove for a bit of snorkeling or paddleboarding before lunch and cocktails.

CASTLES IN THE SAND

For those whose idea of a perfect vacation doesn't include rolling decks or saltwater submersion, Los Cabos offers plenty of other attractive options. Playa El Médano is the largest and most popular beach in Cabo San Lucas, a 2-mile stretch of golden sand that looks out across the bay toward the evocatively shaped granite monuments that comprise much of the city's half-mile Land's End headland. These iconic formations mark the southernmost point of the nearly 800-mile Baja California peninsula. El Arco, the most famous, is an arch-like barrier between the Sea of Cortez and the Pacific Ocean, weathered to its signature shape by millions of years of watery erosion.

Playa El Médano is an idyllic spot for sunbathing and building sandcastles, and is welcoming to walks along its wave-kissed shores and long afternoons sampling fresh local seafood and saltrimmed margaritas at an abundance of bars and restaurants where barefoot lounging trends.

THE SPORT THAT JACK BUILT

In the early 1990s, Los Cabos began its shift from a simple fishing escape to a sophisticated high-end destination, when a developer named Don Koll brought in legendary golfer Jack Nicklaus to design a championship-level course at Palmilla Golf Club. Flash forward to today, and The Golden Bear's total of locally designed courses has risen to six, including Cabo del Sol's gorgeous Ocean Course, which ranked among Golf Magazine's Top 100 Courses in the World.

The most acclaimed course in Los Cabos' brief but glorious golf history, however, is Davis Love III's Dunes Course at Diamante,

a rugged links-style loop that's currently placed 36th-best in the aforementioned list. Love's masterpiece and two neighboring courses from fellow major champion Tiger Woods remain exclusively private, but tee times are available to timeshare guests at The Resort at Diamante, who can also enjoy access to the celebrated Greg Norman design at Rancho San Lucas — a layout exquisitely contoured to Cabo San Lucas' breathtaking Pacific Coast.

DESTINATION RELAXATION

Big-game fishing, beautiful beaches, and challenging golf are just some of the popular draws to Los Cabos; there's also a proliferation of pampering spas positioning the region as an attractive option for destination weddings and romantic escapes.

Spas have now grown so expansive and all-encompassing in their services that they are largely distinguished by their signature treatments. Popular experiences include temazcal, a traditional sweat lodge ritual that dates to the time of the Aztecs, and wellness therapies that emphasize the curative properties of the Sea of Cortez's mineral-rich waters.

In Cabo, sooner or later, everything comes back to its waters.





A glow rose from the caldera seconds after the sun the lava spit a firework into the night sky. My older son drew his breath; no longer complaining about the hours we'd spent walking and driving to experience the world's most dependable volcanic display. My younger boy reached up to clasp my hand, his voice low, he echoed the whispers around us on the overlook, "It's alive. Amazing."

Frankly, "amazing" was an understatement. The island of Hawaii (also known as the Big Island) might just be the most interesting natural environment on the planet. The largest land mass in the Hawaiian chain is ever-changing: You can see an active volcano spewing lava into the sea, a snowcapped dormant landscapes — all in a day.

However, the island's sheer mass can overwhelm visitors, especially those, such as us, on vacation with young children. Like most parents, we desperately needed some real relaxation. We fantasized about hours lazing around white-sand beaches, swimming in the warm ocean among sea turtles and reef fish, and dining with the waves lapping nearby. Yet, we also understood the island held a prime educational resource for our children. Where else can you watch new earth being birthed right before your eyes? So we knew we had to brave the island's size, add some time and patience to our itinerary, and take a road trip to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park.

But not until after we clocked some serious beach time.

LAY OF THE LAND

Imagine this particular landmass as fraternal twins. The rainy Hilo side, which is closer to the Kilauea volcano, seeps with history. The ancients created triangular farming regions meant to sustain the com-Mauna Kea, and dazzling beaches hugged by lush munity on the lush mountainsides, and today, home to one of Hawaii's premier research universities, Hilo



bustles with street markets, rocky beaches, and international eateries.

Because we wanted more dependable weather, we chose to stay on the sunnier Kona side, which essentially runs the length of the island's western seaboard, and is split into two main regions: the Kohala Coast (including the Waikoloa resort area) and Kailua-Kona itself.

Lava rock dots the arid topography, evoking a lunar landscape that spills into the impossibly blue sea. Regal resorts line prime beaches (all of which remain public), and plenty of restaurants for all budgets

hug the various complexes. Kona, the largest community on this side of the island, features walkable commercial stretches along the coast, including Alii Drive, a popular spot for travelers because of the varied eateries, boutiques, and bars.

THE SEA OF POSSIBILITIES

A local friend instructed us to make the resort village of Waikoloa our base. "Its proximity to the Kohala Coast and Kona make it a good choice with kids," Lisa told us. While it may seem a bit bustling for those wanting to escape the masses, we appreciated that a grocery, farmers market, and plenty of restaurants were within walking distance of our accommodations.



Two prime shopping areas (the Kings' Shops and the Queens' MarketPlace) offered nightly live music, serious aloha souvenir–hunting opportunities (as in Honolua Surf Co. and Reyn Spooner), and various dinner options, including Roy's Waikoloa, where the crispy blue crab cakes, organic farmer's salad, and pepper-crusted Big Island ahi will not disappoint.

During our first couple of days, we chilled out at Anaehoomalu Beach, otherwise known as A-Bay — a choice snorkeling spot, swimming area (though watch out for flying boogie boards), and year-round stand-up paddleboarding (SUP) destination. On the edge of the beach, the sand-in-your-toes restaurant Lava Lava Beach Club made it all too easy to sidle up each evening for fruity cocktails and pork nachos while watching the sun set over the sea.



Before we got too acclimated to the slow pace of the tropics, though, we signed up for a snorkel tour with Fair Wind Big Island Ocean Guides to Kealakekua Bay. It's quite possibly the island's most pristine area to spot sea life. The knowledgeable guides strapped the boys in life vests, offered them boogie boards with eyeholes, and led us all on a four-and-a-half-hour morning journey to swim with sea turtles and witness the Hawaiian state fish (humuhumunukunukuapuaa) feeding around the colorful coral that rings the shore.

Excited by the abundant sea life, the boys begged us to book another boat trip — this time a whale-watching journey with captain Dan McSweeney. Twice daily during most of winter and spring, McSweeney, a life-long researcher and conservationist, pilots his boat out to view the local humpback whale breeding grounds. Although, the whale spouts didn't excite my boys as much as the acrobatic spinner dolphins that frolicked in the boat's wake while we motored about the ocean.

PASSAGE OF THE ANCIENTS

The island of Hawaii's identity is built upon its land as much as its sea, which is why a sojourn to the island's most famous landmark proved impossible to pass up. But the distance between Waikoloa and Volcanoes National Park is vast, so we made a full day of it. After breakfast at Island Lava Java, we headed south for a quick morning stroll around Kona town to see Ahuena Heiau — a former

home of King Kamehameha — and to purchase picnic fixings at the beloved Da Poke Shack.

Above town, the esteemed Kona Coffee Belt is revealed. This region is characterized by verdant hillsides and a low-key vibe. Sensing it was a good time to let the boys out of the car, we stopped at Mountain Thunder Coffee Plantation, one of the largest organic coffee farms in the state, and signed up for the Roast Master Experience (mainly because we got to roast about four pounds of beans to take home). Our fun guide even charmed the kids into learning about the entire life cycle of the coffee bean.

As we said goodbye, he suggested we visit Puuhonua o Honaunau National Historical Park for our next pit stop. So about an hour later, we pulled up to 180 acres of beachfront property that was once one of native Hawaiian society's most significant destinations.

In ancient times, if someone had broken a sacred law, called *kapu*, they could be sentenced to death. To mainlanders, the kapu system was extreme, but to Hawaiians, it was how they kept order. Fortunately, the natives allowed one get-out-of-jail-free card: If the offender could evade capture en route to the place of refuge — a *puuhonua* — he could absolve himself and return to society.

At the site, Pacific Islander architecture and statues line the sea, and for a place with such a nerve-racking history, it could not be more picturesque. We wandered amid thatched-roof hales (homes), burial sites, fishponds, and the Hale o Keawe, a temple

constructed in the late 1600s or so. We struggled to tear the boys away from the cultural demonstrations (especially the traditional Hawaiian games), but the promise of seeing a real volcano finally got them moving.

When we rounded the horn of the island, we bypassed the turnoff to Kalae, the southernmost point in the U.S., in favor of racing to Naalehu's famed Punaluu Bake Shop & Visitor Center for the island's best *malasadas* — delicious Portuguese doughnuts and other treats.

A few miles later, the "vog" (volcanic smog) rolled in, and then we entered the domain of Pele, Hawaiian goddess of fire: Hawaii Volcanoes National Park. There were barren, ashen landscapes and dense, seemingly out-of-place fern forests. This geologic wonder, where lava has been erupting — or at least oozing — from Kilauea's Puu Oo vent since 1983, continuously drops jaws of all ages.


Start your sightseeing at the Visitor Center. There's an endless amount of information available, as well as rangers who are happy to instruct you about how to plan your time at the park. Since we'd already been in the car for a few hours, we skipped Crater Rim Drive, an 11-mile circumnavigation of the summit's caldera. Instead, we stopped briefly at the Kilauea Overlook and then parked at the Kilauea Iki Overlook. We hiked a short section of the rim, and watched a handful of brave folks descend some 400 feet into the Kilauea Iki Crater for a 4-mile trek around the fossilized lava lake bed.

Afterward, we meandered onward to the Thurston Lava Tube to submerge ourselves in the Jurassic forest of dripping ferns and namesake subterranean cavern. Before the sun could set, we joined the masses in watching the stunning scene at Halemaumau Crater, which is home to a living lava lake that glows an ominous red after dark. Staring into this natural phenomenon, we taught the boys about the magma that formed the entire island, as well as her sisters. A ranger popped his head in to tell them about the new island being birthed underwater as we spoke.

The next morning, the boys chatted about the magnificence of our planet and how they wanted to come back to Hawaii to see the new island — not to mention the actual lava flow (which is possible with trained guides who take the intrepid on hikes, boat trips, or helicopter rides). It was all very exciting — and I'm already looking forward to these next Big Island adventures.

Still, when we asked what we should do for our last day of *this* trip — posing options for hiking, biking, or surfing — they gave it about two seconds' thought before explaining that they wanted to leave some of that for next time, and asking if we could simply return to our favorite stretch of sand, A-Bay, for some swimming, yummy eats, and, most importantly, some of that relaxation we'd been talking about.

Double down at the casinos, hang ten in the surf, and witness some great sights of pure Americana.

Where to do it: Whether you prefer slot machines or table games, the Borgata won't disappoint. It has a 161,000-square-foot casino floor with more than 3,475 slots and 250 tables. Experienced surfers can head straight to Crystal Beach, but if you're looking for lessons, check out the AC Surf School. Don't miss Lucy the Elephant south of town in Margate.

Why go now: The casinos are fun year-round. But when the weather warms up during late spring and summer, Atlantic City becomes a full-blown beach destination, too. It's like a two-for-one vacation experience.


Insider's tip: Tony's Baltimore Grill is hardly a secret. Indeed, it's been a landmark eatery since 1927. Most visitors order the pizza. And the specialty pies — with clam sauce or Buffalo chicken or cherry peppers — are hard to resist. But locals will suggest you try the fried-shrimp platter.

With incessant sunshine and nearly 100 miles of beach, Fuerteventura is a warm-weather, outdoor-lover's delight. In fact, thanks to its volcanic landscape, paleontological sites, and that aforementioned coastline, the entire island was designated a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve in 2009.

What to do: Beach hop. Digging your toes in the sand and working on your tan is the name of the game here. The only challenge is deciding which strand best suits your style. There are plenty of stretches where lounging is about as active as things get, but windsurfing is very popular, too.

Where to do it: Flag Beach at the north end of the island and Costa Calma in the south are prime places to learn how to windsurf —

or show off your moves if you're already a pro. If peace and quiet is what you seek, consider La Concha and Cofete Beach. Cofete is tough to reach (you'll need a four-wheel-drive vehicle), but the unspoiled setting is worth the trip.

Why go now: Spring is generally regarded as the least crowded time of year, while the influx of summer visitors means a more festive island vibe.

Insider's tip: Sample the local cheeses. La Villa dairy farm in Llano de Santa Catalina is a perfect place to start. They produce a variety of artisanal goat's milk cheeses and offer tours of the facilities.

- This landmark is its city's oldest structure, built in 1598 with imported stone slabs, bronze, sand, and whale oil. It was constructed along the reef to ensure a strong foundation, and is separated from the coast by a sandbar.

Settlers hoped that the stronghold would deter pirates from coming ashore.
- Today, the site serves as a museum, where visitors can access the former barracks, prison warehouses, and a chapel with a water well. The fort retains its original form — most notably a five-point maritime design.



AN UP-CLOSE LOOK AT ARIZONA'S

GOLDFIELD GHOST TOWN



he historic Apache Trail snakes 40 miles through the sweeping canyons and man-made desert lakes of Arizona's scenic backcountry. Along this mostly unpaved path, at the base of the Superstition Mountains, lies Goldfield, a former gold-mining town established in 1893, and known today as Goldfield Ghost Town.

By the early 1900s, Goldfield's abundant mines and famous tales of the elusive Lost Dutchman's Gold Mine lured opportunists in the hopes of striking it rich. Local mines produced more than \$1.5 million worth of gold before their ore

quality eventually dropped and the miners moved on, leaving Goldfield a ghost town.

Less than a one-hour drive from Interval's Phoenix-area resorts, the town has since been authentically reconstructed, bringing the early Wild West mining experience to life. Visitors can pan for gold, take a train ride along the narrow-gauge railway, and explore the underground mine. After touring the Mystery Shack, step into the saloon for a drink, saddle up at the stables, and enjoy a reenactment by the Goldfield Gunfighters.


