

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




Understanding inventory — the resort weeks in Interval's system — is tantamount to understanding the exchange process. Kevin Wutzler, who has been with Interval for 28 years, is here to answer our questions.

# Why is it so important for weeks-based members to deposit and then place a request?

The best chance of being confirmed into the resort and time period a member wants is achieved through Interval's pending request process. As new weeks enter the system from member and developer deposits, the weeks are first assigned to pending requests *before* being assigned to members shopping for an instant confirmation on intervalworld.com. It's also

important to place requests as early as possible — up to two years in advance of your travel date. This gives us more time to find a suitable match — using our comparable exchange concept — when new deposits enter the system.

# How is a member's trading power increased by depositing their week as early as possible?

When using Deposit First, early member deposits give us more time to ensure that the inventory is fully utilized and optimized to satisfy exchange requests. This translates into a member's week having increased value in the exchange system, which in turn, is passed along to the depositing member in the form of increased trading power, which is similar to buying power. And increased trading power means members have a greater chance at getting the exchange they're after.

# OK, we talked about Deposit First. Why would a member opt for Request First instead?

Request First allows members to shop the Interval network for exactly what they want, all the while retaining their home resort usage right or points until they find what they're looking for *and* receive a confirmation. I like to think of it as when I was a kid trading baseball cards with my friends: I would never have given up one of my Reggie Jackson cards without knowing exactly what I was getting in return!

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

# **Atlantic City, New Jersey UNDER THE BOARDWALK**

Atlantic City is dazzling enough with its famous boardwalk lined with glitzy casinos — but it's far more than a gaming hotspot. And summer is the ideal time to discover what lies beyond the poker tables. So, aside from getting to play a hand or two, here are three reasons to visit the Entertainment Capital of the Jersey Shore during the warmer months of the year.

# ATLANTIC CITY VEGAN FOOD FESTIVAL -

Learn about the plant-based lifestyle - and how delicious it can be — at the second annual Atlantic City Vegan Food Festival. Taking place July 12 to 14, the two-day event includes a food truck party and a 5K/10K run along the boardwalk, plus guest speakers and cooking demonstrations during the main vendor showcase at the Showboat Atlantic City hotel. From chocolate brownies and pork-less barbecue sliders to artisanal bath and body products, enjoy all things herbivorous — even if just for a weekend. Admission is free for children 13 and under.



- ATLANTIC CITY INTERNATIONAL AIR SHOW Pick a spot on the beach along the boardwalk for a front-row view of the spectacular aerial maneuvers performed right above you. Usual participants of the Atlantic City International Air Show, happening Aug. 21, include the U.S. Air Force Thunderbirds, as well as the Canadian Forces Snowbirds and the U.S. Army Golden Knights. You may also get to see parachute demonstrations and a thrilling race between the Miss GEICO catamaran and one of the GEICO Skytypers Airshow Team's vintage WWII aircraft.
- **TENNESSEE AVENUE BEER HALL** Sip on an ice-cold brew and spend the afternoon playing arcade games at this newly opened beer hall, located mere steps from the beach. There are more than 100 craft beers to choose from, on draft and by the bottle, as well as creative cocktails and a food menu curated by local chef Charles Soreth. House specialties include lobster tater tots, a soft pretzel served with mustard and beer-cheese sauce, a Black Angus burger topped with caramelized onions and Gruyere, and a bacon-wrapped hot dog with avocado puree and pico de gallo.



WILLIAMSBURG, VIRGINIA THRILLING HEIGHTS AND DEPTHS

Kick up the exhilaration factor with two new rides at Williamsburg's theme parks: At Busch Gardens, admire the view from 80 feet above ground while swinging higher and higher as Finnegan's Flyer's pendulum-style arms propel you back and forth at 45 mph. And, at Water Country USA, Busch Gardens' sister park, check out the Cutback Water Coaster, a jet-propelled slide featuring four-person rafts that drop through steep 850-foot-long winding tunnels in between saucer-like open spaces.

# LAS VEGAS, NEVADA

SENSORY TRAVEL MAGIC

Kind Heaven is a virtually immersive encounter unlike anything else on The Strip, and will welcome its first audiences at The Ling Promenade late this summer. Co-created by Jane's Addiction frontman and Lollapalooza co-founder Perry Farrell, this 360-degree, multisensory entertainment venture transports visitors to the many worlds of Southeast Asia, allowing them to see, hear, touch, taste, and even smell their voyage. The masterminds behind the attraction have designed special effects and wearable technologies to create customized journeys for each quest. The experience shifts from day to night — by day, holograms and animated animals will leave kids in awe as they learn about new cultures, and at night, Kind Heaven transforms into an adult playground, complete with nightclubs, street performers, and sake bombs.



# Vail, Colorado WHISTLE STOP

Whistle Pig Vail is back for its sophomore year in the Rockies, rewarding music lovers with a summer-long run of headliner concerts at the Gerald R. Ford Amphitheater. The series brings celebrated rock, pop. country, and bluegrass bands with intergenerational appeal for shows from June through September. For the curious, "whistle pig" is a nickname for a type of marmot or woodchuck that gets its moniker from its high-pitched whistle when alarmed. While they've been spotted around the amphitheater for years, they will probably hightail it underground during the shows.

Boxi Park, a one-of-a-kind entertainment district made entirely of repurposed shipping containers, has made its home at Lake Nona Town Center. The park also features a food hall concept, with a varying lineup of restaurants showcasing multiple cuisines. # BACKSTAGE ACCESS

Get a behind-the-scenes look at the white rhinoceroses that live inside Disney's Animal Kingdom. 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
# **0-Town** EATS

Trade in chopsticks for your hands at Sticky Rice, a Laotian street-food joint that serves traditional Southeast Asian cuisine in paper boats.

THE SETTING: Located in an unassuming strip mall about 10 minutes from downtown Orlando, Sticky Rice operates as a counter-service eatery, with a handful of long, wooden tables and metal stools. A mural of a threeheaded elephant is painted along one of the concrete walls inside the restaurant, symbolic of both Buddhism and the Laotian national animal. Rolls of paper towels are placed as table centerpieces so patrons can eat freely with their hands.

THE MENU: The selection of small plates is perfect for sharing and trying a variety of Laotian favorites - and everything is under \$10! The go-to here is the restaurant's namesake dish, which is served with two dips: jaew bong (a sweet chili paste with pork skin) and jaew som (an acidic lime and chili sauce). You also can include sticky rice with other menu items, or opt for crisp lettuce wraps — for the laab gai (chopped chicken with herbs), for example. Lemongrass pork sausage, beef meatball skewers marinated in a sweet chili sauce, spicy papaya salad, and pork tapioca dumplings are all a must-try. For dessert, choose between the mango sticky rice topped with coconut cream, or sweet purple rice served in a bamboo stem with coconut gelato.

THE PARTICULARS: Sticky Rice is open every Monday through Saturday, from 11:30 a.m. to 10 p.m., and on Sundays from 11:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. For more information, call 321-800-6532.


# Hall Yes!

FOOD HALLS ARE POPPING UP ALL OVER THE WORLD, OFFERING AN ELEVATED FAST-CASUAL CONCEPT THAT BRINGS VARIETY TO THE FORE.

You pace the grounds of a renovated warehouse with floor-to-ceiling windows and exposed brick walls, taking in the mix of aromas emanating from various food stalls. The more you look, the harder it gets to decide whether you want a bowl of lamb curry from one vendor or an assortment of sashimi from another, while also eyeing that plate of chicken and waffles someone at a nearby table is eating. One thing is certain: There's something for everyone, and that's a victory for eaters all around.

Most food halls feature communal dining spaces with a carefully curated selection of vendors — a mix of well-known talents and local startups — all cooking under one roof. Beyond the appeal of a unique dining experience in a distinctive setting, several of these venues also showcase live bands and DJs, and host cooking workshops, wine tastings, and so much more. Many are located in mixed-used developments that have become de facto entertainment hubs. No two are the same, so each of these — all within Interval resort areas — is definitely worth a visit.



#### **ANAHEIM PACKING HOUSE: PROHIBITION-ERA FEEL**

Lay of the Land: In Anaheim, California, this two-story food hall opened in 2014 in a restored 20th-century warehouse that once served as a Sunkist citrus-packing plant. (The logo is still on the sign at the entrance.) Only 2 miles from Disneyland Park, the landmark structure now houses more than 20 vendors covering a range of cuisines — from American comfort food to wood-fired Neapolitan pizza to authentic Syrian fare. The complex is also home to a handful of restaurants — including the popular Umami Burger — and two breweries in the adjacent buildings.


**The Game Plan:** Leave your diet behind: Dip goat cheese-filled naan into a steaming bowl of curry at Adya, munch on crispy fish and chips at The Chippy Fish & Grill, and sink your teeth into a Cap'n Crunch waffle sundae at The Iron Press. And with seven different types of poutine

on the menu, you just can't miss indulging at The Kroft. Then head over to Popbar to choose between a gelato, sorbet, or yogurt ice pop to dip, drizzle, and sprinkle with your favorite toppings.

**Wow Factor:** Step back in time at The Blind Rabbit speakeasy — that is, if you're able to find the secret door. Or grab a drink at the BXCR (also known as The Underground Wine Society), located inside a refurbished 1920s railroad boxcar.

**Off-Menu:** Anaheim Packing House regularly showcases live bands, from country to rock to rhythm and blues. It also hosts jazz nights on the first and third Thursday of every month inside the Cooks Chapel event venue.

**Also Try:** Windmill Food Hall in Carlsbad, as well as Little Italy Food Hall and Liberty Public Market in San Diego





#### THE HALL ON FRANKLIN: AT YOUR SERVICE

Lay of the Land: Tampa, Florida's first food hall opened in late 2017 inside a yellow-brick building from the 1920s, in one of the city's oldest neighborhoods. Offerings include cute latte art, Liège (sweet Belgian-style) waffles, fancy grilled-cheese combinations, and colorful poke bowls.

**The Game Plan:** Start the evening with a cocktail from local mixologist Ro Patel's bar, Collection. Order the signature stinky bunz (filled bao, or dumpling sliders) from North Star Eatery, and share a half-dozen raw oysters from Heights Fish Camp, served with lemon wedges and mignonette sauce in a plastic pipette. Finish off with a dessert from Bake'n Babes, whose quirky confections include Cinnamon Toast Crunch cereal—milk ice cream and Irish car bomb cupcakes.



**Wow Factor:** Unlike most other food halls, The Hall on Franklin offers sit-down table service in addition to counter service, and you can order from any — or all — of the seven "taste architects" from your chair.

**Off-Menu:** The Hall on Franklin hosts DJs and other special events, such as silent parties — where you dance to music on wireless headphones.

**Also Try:** Heights Public Market, just a half-mile from The Hall on Franklin

#### BLOCK 16 URBAN FOOD HALL: EAST COAST MEETS WEST COAST

Lay of the Land: The Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas in Nevada, known for its impressive collection of dining venues, introduced six restaurants — some of which were new to the region — when it opened Block 16 Urban Food Hall in late 2018. The list of vendors includes a New York–based mezcal and tequila bar, a Portland-based eatery by a James Beard Award–winning chef, and two popular restaurants from New Orleans, Louisiana, and Nashville, Tennessee.

**The Game Plan:** Begin with a visit to Ghost Donkey for a sip of tequila, and snack on an order of truffle nachos. Once you've worked up an appetite, stop at chef Andy Ricker's famous Pok Pok Wing and try lke's Vietnamese fish-sauce wings, which were featured in an episode of Guy Fieri's *Diners*, *Drive-Ins and Dives*. Be sure to leave room for one of the daily flavors at District: Donuts. Sliders. Brew.

**Off-Menu:** You're just steps away from all the casinos along The Strip, so that's a no-brainer!

Also Try: Fulton Street Food Hall at Harrah's Las Vegas Hotel and Casino

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#### ST. ROCH MARKET: THE GRANDFATHER OF FOOD HALLS

Lay of the Land: New Orleans' St. Roch Market has existed in some way, shape, or form since the 1870s. Originally a stateowned, open-air market, this historic venue later became a privately owned seafood merchant until it was nearly destroyed during Hurricane Katrina in 2005. A decade after being shuttered, St. Roch Market reopened as an upscale food hall with the intent of bringing in vendors who are testing out new ideas before venturing out with stand-alone restaurants.

The Game Plan: Satisfy your Southern seafood cravings with golden-brown crab cakes, oysters on the half-shell, gumbo, and shrimp and grits. If you're after variety, Vietnamese pho (rice-noodle soup), Haitian street food, and veggie-centric options, such as avocado toast, kale salad, and an array of guinoa

bowls, are a must-try. Stop by The Mayhaw for an inventive craft cocktail, and don't miss their weekday happy hour for \$6 drink specials. **Other Locations**: In 2018, St. Roch Market opened its second location in Miami, Florida, and is looking to open a third outpost in Nashville. **Also Try:** Auction House Market (from the same operator as St. Roch Market) and Phythian Market, both in New Orleans

#### 1-800-LUCKY: FLAVORS OF ASIA

Lay of the Land: Set in Miami's trendy Wynwood neighborhood, this food hall features seven vendors — handpicked from Japan, New York, California, and South Florida — that cover a wide range of Asian cuisines, including dim sum, sushi, ramen, and banh mi (Vietnamesestyle baquette sandwich).

**The Game Plan:** A bowl of pork ramen from Hayato Miami or an ahi tuna poke bowl from Poke OG is a must, but don't leave without trying the soup dumplings from Yip and the Peking duck buns from Lotus + Cleaver. Wash your meal down with a frozen Kirin Ichiban beer. (This is one of only two places in Florida that serve it.) On your way out, stop by Taiyaki NYC, located on the outside terrace, for a swirl of matcha ice cream topped with a strawberry drizzle and served in an adorable fish-shaped cone — it's totally Instagramable!

**Off-Menu:** There's a vinyl record shop and a convenience store by the entrance, plus a karaoke room for private parties. The venue regularly hosts local DJs and transforms the outdoor dining terrace into a dance floor.

**Also Try:** La Centrale at Brickell City Centre in downtown Miami and St. Roch Market's outpost in the Miami Design District

#### **EATALY: EAT LIKE AN ITALIAN**

Lay of the Land: This Italian-themed food emporium started out in 2007 in an old vermouth factory in Turin, Italy. Now, Eataly is a global brand, with more than 40 locations around the world, including Florence and Bari in Italy, and Chicago, Illinois, and Boston, Massachusetts, in the U.S.



**The Game Plan:** The offerings vary per location, but in general, Eataly's specialized restaurants and quick-service counters are dedicated to pasta, pizza, seafood, meat, cheese, and seasonal vegetables. No matter what you dine on, you're guaranteed fresh Italian eats accompanied by fine Italian wines.

**Off-Menu:** This is more than a food hall — it's a hybrid model that's part grocery store and part artisanal marketplace. It also hosts cooking courses and wine tastings.

**Other Locations:** Check out Paris' newly opened Eataly at the Galeries Lafayette, which holds the exclusive franchise rights in France. The three-story food hall includes seven restaurants, a courtyard fruit and vegetable market, cafes, and a wine cellar. And on the high seas, get a taste of Eataly aboard select ships on MSC Cruises. See page 84 for more details.

#### **GOURMAND FOOD HALL: WORLDLY TASTES**

Lay of the Land: Gourmand Food Hall, which bills itself as "Argentina's first food hall," opened in late 2016 inside the Patio Bullrich shopping mall in Buenos Aires. It features several French elements, including a bistro, a meat and cheese mart, and a boulangerie (French-style bakery) and patisserie (pastry shop). It also has an Italian restaurant, a rotisserie counter, a sushi and oyster bar, a sommelier-led wine bar, and a burger joint and beer hall.

**The Game Plan:** Here you're covered from breakfast to dinner. Order a pain au chocolat (chocolate roll) with coffee in the morning to kickstart your day of shopping; indulge in an Angus-burger-and-lager pairing before catching a matinee upstairs at the movie theater; and finish your night with a grilled octopus appetizer followed by a duck magret entree.


Off-Menu: Shop for sweet souvenirs at Le Marché (the market), where you'll find an array of international and national artisanal products. Gourmand Food Hall regularly offers culinary classes, special multicourse dinners, and wine tastings, and hosts the annual Gourmand Taste Festival. ■

# As Scene on Screen

WHILE CGI CAN CREATE STUNNING
ON-SCREEN LANDSCAPES, SOME REAL-WORLD
ELEMENTS JUST CAN'T BE BEAT.

he best cinematography is transformative. The scenery it captures in your favorite movie or TV show can create a sense of adoration or nostalgia. Though the imagination comes to life in front of the green screen, movie magic is often made in a natural setting outside of the studio. Revisiting these incredible panoramas in person puts you right in the action — sans lights and cameras. Here, we highlight filming locations throughout the world that offer a variety of fan experiences. Snap that must-have selfie at the location of your favorite TV scene, or take a tour of iconic movie sites. And these attractions are all within easy reach of Interval resort areas.

#### PTERODACTYL'S-EYE VIEW

On an island in the central Pacific, a man-eating-predator film was born. Kauai, Hawaii's vibrant jungle sets the stage for the 1993 science fiction adventure flick *Jurassic Park*. There are several details that make this movie so special, from the ahead-of-its-time visual effects to the man-versus-nature theme, and most importantly, dinosaurs! But the setting is also worth admiring, and the iconic helicopter scene that depicts the team's journey to Isla Nublar features the dense forest and impressive Manawaiopuna Falls of the Hanapepe Valley as its backdrop.

**WHAT TO DO:** Fly the same course with Island Helicopters Kauai, offering tours from Lihue Airport on the island's east coast. Spark those movie memories as you soar over the rugged terrain and imagine a world of dinosaurs below. Enjoy the once-in-a-lifetime experience of landing at the base of the 400-foot waterfall nestled deep within the lush valley, otherwise inaccessible to the public.

While you marvel at the falls, learn about the area's history and wild-life from the knowledgeable pilot.

#### **SET IN STONE**

On its eighth and final season, HBO's fantasy *Game of Thrones* has captivated millions of viewers around the world. It's also a critical sensation; the series holds the record for the most Emmy wins in a year for a TV show (2015). No wonder: The show's cinematography, among other aspects, is astounding. Less than a one-hour drive from Barcelona, Spain, is the Castle of Saint Florentina in Canet de Mar. This 11th-century medieval stronghold played host to the show's cast and crew as they filmed key scenes for its sixth season on-site. The castle serves as Horn Hill, the family home for House Tarly, and is seen in the season's sixth episode when Night's Watch steward Samwell Tarly arrives with Gilly. Scenes take place in the castle's courtyard, the spacious throne hall, and an elegant bedroom.

Doune Castle, in central Scotland's Stirling district, was featured in the series as Winterfell, the ancestral home of House Stark. In the pilot episode, exterior shots are easily recognizable, and the scene of the great feast held to celebrate King Robert Baratheon's arrival includes incredible interior shots.

The castle is no stranger to fame, and has been featured in other films and TV shows over the years, including the 1975 cult classic *Monty Python and the Holy Grail* and the Starz original series *Outlander*.

**WHAT TO DO:** Explore real-life history and fascinating fictional worlds at these astonishing fortresses. Audio tours are available at Doune Castle, and Castle of Saint Florentina offers guided tours


on Saturdays and every third Sunday of the month (except when closed for events). Reservations are required. During the escorted excursion at Castle of Saint Florentina, visitors will learn about the history, architecture, and other secrets of the palace, and are offered a delicious glass of Spanish sparkling wine at the end of the tour.

#### **SUMMERTIME CINEMA**

Back on the mainland, hop the ferry from Cape Cod to Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts, to explore the real-life beach towns that gave life to Amity Island, the fictional setting of the 1975 film **Jaws**. This original summer blockbuster is still considered one of the greatest movies of all time, and the recurring notes of its famous chill-evoking score have become the theme song of impending doom in pop culture. On Martha's Vineyard, communities embrace the claim to fame with tribute events, weekly summer screenings, and an overabundance of movie merchandise in the quaint seaside shops (seriously — you're gonna need a bigger boat).

**WHAT TO DO:** Sink your teeth into Edgartown Tour Company's family-friendly one-hour walking tour to get the inside scoop on the thriller's production. Tread in the footsteps of protagonist Chief Brody as you visit the sites from the big screen — such as the police station, ferry, Main Street, town hall, and more — and discover the impact the film had on Martha's Vineyard and the world.

Want to brush up on all the scenes before taking the tour? From late June through August, stop by the historic Capawock Theatre in Vineyard Haven to catch a Friday showing of the beloved picture.





#### A HERO'S JOURNEY

On New Zealand's North Island, venture into the verdant pastures of the Shire to experience the delightful Hobbiton community featured in the popular movie trilogies *The Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit*. The enchanting 12-acre Hobbiton Movie Set site is adorned with the landscaping, decor, and accessories used in the movies. It's located just outside the town of Matamata, an hour and a half north of Taupo, and two hours south of Auckland.

Farther south — about 90 minutes from Taupo and 45 minutes from Turangi — is Tongariro National Park, where a number of scenes from both film series were created. While often digitally enhanced, the area's desolate landscapes have been used as the setting for Mordor, the movies' archvillain Sauron's home base, including the vast Whakapapa and Tukino ski areas, and the barren Rangipo Desert.

Shots of the park's beautiful Mount Ngauruhoe, an active volcano, were transformed with CGI (computer-generated imagery) to create Mount Doom, a fictional volcano and hero Frodo Baggins' ultimate destination in *The Lord of the Rings*.

WHAT TO DO: Take a guided tour of Hobbiton Movie Set to discover where and how your favorite scenes were shot. See the quaint and colorful Hobbit Holes, visit the Old Mill, and enjoy a complimentary Hobbit-style beverage at the famed Green Dragon Inn. There's a cafe on-site with outdoor seating that provides fantastic views of the surrounding farmland and mountains. And if you're bringing souvenirs home, stop by the Shire Store for an extensive selection of themed gifts.

Reenact your favorite scenes and capture stunning panoramas of Tongariro National Park's remarkable terrain. While experienced hikers (and extreme fans) may want to follow Frodo's journey up the mountain, the landmark can be easily admired from below.


# HISTORY AND SONG COME ALIVE IN NASHVILLE.

When you picture Nashville, Tennessee, what comes to mind? Is it the bright neon lights of Lower Broadway or the historic recording studios on Music Row? Do you hear country twang or inventive indie rock? How about dinner: downhome barbecue or creative fare from a James Beard Award—winning chef?

Remarkably, a trip to Nashville encompasses all of this and more. Nashville has long been known as Music City, but in recent years, the Tennessee capital has grown to become a premier destination for dining, art, shopping, and sports, too. It's perfect for a weekend escape or a weeklong exploration, with something to appeal to just about everyone — country music fan or otherwise.

#### **ROOTED BEGINNINGS**

It's no secret that Nashville is the international hub of country music. Everyone from Willie Nelson to Miranda Lambert has called the Nashville area home, and there's a rich history to be discovered in just about any pocket of town.

Historic RCA Studio B offers daily tours of its facility, which once played host to the likes of Elvis Presley, Porter Wagoner, and Dolly Parton. The studio is located on Music Row, a stretch of historic homes and buildings that still house the bulk of Nashville's music industry offices.

There are sundry walking tours to explore even the city's most hidden musical landmarks. The two-hour Walkin' Nashville: Music City Legends Tour tells the story of how Nashville became Music City, and takes visitors to the former sites of treasures from a bygone era, such as Sho-Bud Steel Guitar Company, established by steel guitarists Harold Bradley "Shot" Jackson and Buddy Emmons in 1965.

#### **RESPECT YOUR ELDERS**

For those looking to learn more about Nashville's musical history, there is no shortage of museums, tours, and educational attractions. The Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum, situated in a large complex downtown, is one of the city's musical crown jewels. Here you'll learn about icons like Johnny Cash and Patsy Cline, while discovering newcomers like Maren Morris and Sturgill Simpson, doing so via memorabilia, interactive exhibits, and a packed schedule of special programming.

Nearby, dig deeper into the histories of Cash and Cline at their respective museums, and stop in the George Jones Museum, too, for a glimpse into The Possum's life — and a rooftop cocktail. The Musicians Hall of Fame and Museum, located near the state capitol, traces the history of recorded music. The institution honors household names, like Jimi Hendrix and Ricky Skaggs, as well as lesser-known studio players who contributed to some of music's most important songs and albums. The venue also houses The Grammy Museum Gallery, a special interactive exhibit that allows guests to learn about the famed music awards.

Historic Jefferson Street in North Nashville showcases vibrant murals and tributes to much of the talent that played the neighborhood in the mid-century, including Hendrix and Little Richard. Visit the Jefferson Street Sound museum to learn more about this vital piece of Nashville's musical history.



#### **TAKE A SPIN**

Vinyl records have made a massive comeback in recent years, and Nashville is a great destination for collectors. On the edge of Pie Town — just south of downtown — you can visit Jack White's (of the White Stripes) Third Man Records, the Willy Wonka's chocolate factory of vinyl fun. Check out the store's rare records and memorabilia, and catch a live show at its famed Blue Room. Third Man also offers weekend tours, and has a 1947 Voice-O-Graph recording booth that allows visitors to record a short audio message directly to a 6-inch phonograph disc.

Nearby, in the growing Wedgewood-Houston community, is United Record Pressing. Said to be the largest manufacturer of vinyl records in North America, URP offers a range of vinyl-related merchandise.

#### **TUNES FOR ALL**

Nashville has long been known for its country music, but just about every genre imaginable thrives here. The Elliston Place Rock Block plays host to two of the city's best-loved rock establishments, Exit/In and The End. The latter boasts rowdy DIY and punk shows, while the former has reached renowned status since opening in 1971. Nearby dive bar Springwater is another great venue for folks hoping to scratch their indie-rock itch and enjoy a cheap brew.

For jazz fans, Rudy's Jazz Room in the Gulch neighborhood is not to be missed. Visitors can enjoy multiple live shows from acclaimed

#### A Taste of Music City

Nashville may be known as Music City, but it's also a prominent food town — one that boasts a plethora of exciting new establishments alongside longtime local classics. Here's a sampling of some of Nashville's best spots to grab a bite.

#### **Homegrown Favorites**

You can't visit Nashville without trying what's perhaps the city's most famous dish: hot chicken. The original purveyor of the spicy, fried dish is **Prince's Hot Chicken Shack**, located northeast of town. You may have to wait in line, but it'll be worth it for the perfectly fried bird. Lovers of Southern food must head to the Gulch, home to the famed **Arnold's Country Kitchen**, which serves a meat and three — Southern shorthand for a main entree and three sides. And try the **Loveless Cafe** southwest of town, where you'll want to be sure to order the biscuits and country ham.

#### **Award-Winning Cuisine**

Folks who live in Nashville can't survive on chicken and biscuits alone. Germantown restaurant **City House** claims Nashville's first James Beard Award—winning chef, Tandy Wilson, and serves rustic Italian fare with a distinctly Southern bent — think mortadella served with chickpeas, frisee, and carrot mostardo. East Nashville's **Margot Café & Bar** is one of the city's older fine dining establishments, and boasts a seasonal menu that changes daily and features dishes like braised pork shank and cornmeal-dusted trout. Nationally renowned chef Philip Krajeck's **Rolf and Daughters** (which ranked third on *Bon Appétit*'s 2013 list of best new American restaurants) serves up handmade pastas.

#### Sweet Fare

Busy days of exploration demand occasional treats. With locations in East Nashville and 12 South, Five Daughters Bakery crafts a beautiful array of artisanal doughnuts, including the 100-layer croissant-doughnut hybrid. Caffeine fiends will find no shortage of fuel throughout the city. Frothy Monkey, whose extensive all-day food menu rivals its beloved espresso drinks, is a sure bet. And on a hot day, stop at 12 South's frozen-pop shop Las Paletas for a sweet, icy treat.

jazz musicians each evening alongside traditional New Orleans-style food and drink. Downtown's Schermerhorn Symphony Center is home to the Grammy-winning Nashville Symphony and also books major touring acts.

#### **FEEL THE RHYTHM**

After you've spent your daylight hours learning about Nashville's music, be sure to save your evenings for *actually* going out and hearing some. A trip to Nashville is never complete without a stop at the Ryman Auditorium, where you can take an educational tour and see what's sure to be an unforgettable live show. After you leave the Ryman, stop in at Robert's Western World, which often features

Mike Wolfe, from the TV show American Pickers, has a Nashville storefront in the historic Marathon Village complex, where visitors can view (and buy) "picked" items, check out show merchandise, and on lucky days, meet one or both of the show's hosts.

prominent local talent, like Third Man Records artist Joshua Hedley.

The Station Inn is the pièce de résistance of the Gulch and has long been known for showcasing some of the world's greatest country and bluegrass artists. Seats are first-come, first-served, and gigs are known to sell out, so get there early. Across the river in East Nashville, The Basement East (affectionately referred to as The Beast) plays host to a wide array of mid-level local and touring acts. Its original counterpart, The Basement, is smaller and dive-ier, and makes for a great place to catch a truly intimate set. And don't miss the chance to see a show at The Bluebird Cafe. Everyone from John Prine to Garth Brooks has played this tiny hotspot — a must-see for any fan of well-crafted songs. Be sure to make reservations, though — the room fills up fast.

For an authentic "local" experience, check out Honky Tonk Tuesdays at the American Legion Post 82, which always features some of the best players in town. The Listening Room Cafe and Douglas Corner Cafe are great places for discovering up-and-coming songwriters. And hey, it's Nashville, so if you hear music drifting out of an establishment, chances are it's going to be good. Wander on in and listen up.

#### **CREATIVELY SOUND**

Nashville is also home to many prominent cultural institutions that *aren't* related to music. The Frist Art Museum, located up the hill from the bars of Lower Broadway, houses a rotating roster of internationally renowned art exhibitions. The Carl Van Vechten Gallery at Fisk University is home to a biennial exhibit: the private art collection of Georgia O'Keeffe, which features works by Paul Cézanne, Pablo Picasso, and O'Keeffe herself.

On the first Saturday of each month, Nashville hosts the First Saturday Art Crawl, which takes place downtown on Fifth Avenue of the Arts. Prominent art-crawl galleries include the Rymer Gallery, as well as over a dozen more inside the historic Arcade. Wedgewood-Houston gets in on the art action, too, with Arts & Music at Wedgewood-Houston, a similarly styled event that also takes place on the first Saturday of each month.

#### **ON THE RECORD**

You can't leave Nashville without a bag full of records and CDs. For history buffs, Ernest Tubb Record Shop on Lower Broadway is a must-visit. Opened in 1947, the store now carries new releases, used vinyl, music books, and music merchandise. Grimey's, which moved to a large new East Nashville location last fall, is a music-collector's dream, with an expansive selection of new music, used gems, and a stocked calendar of live in-store events, with local and touring musicians.

Also in East Nashville is Fond Object, another independent record shop that is a pillar of the Riverside Village community and, in addition to music, sells vintage clothing, housewares, and original artwork. The Groove record store is convenient to much of the neighborhood's nightlife and dining, and is a great spot for music nerds who love sifting through crates in search of hidden treasures.


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
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My husband, Benjamin, and I have always chased Mexico from the windswept dunes of Baja to the blue agave fields of Tequila. We make it a priority to head south at least once a year, crossing the border for a dose of culture and customs far removed from our own.

Our latest quest takes us to Riviera Maya, the Caribbean coastline that stretches 100 miles south of boisterous Cancún, to Punta Allen in the Sian Ka'an Biosphere Reserve. Our route launches from Bahía Petempich, where the party atmosphere fades and tranquility begins.

From here, we follow the course along Carretera 307, the main thoroughfare that cuts all the way to the border of Belize. With a map and a plan, we wonder when we'll catch a glimpse of the pristine beaches we have heard so much about. As we head east — past dirt roads and thick mangroves — it's not long until we reach powdery white sands, turquoise waters, and bottle-green lagoons. Vibrant marine life darts beneath the surface, bridged by an underground network of rivers, caves, and freshwater sinkholes known as cenotes. Tucked into the jungle landscapes are Mayan ruins dating to around A.D. 500.

We have been on the ground less than 24 hours, and already, Riviera Maya is hum-

#### **PUERTO MORELOS AND THE MESOAMERICAN REEF**

At the gateway to Riviera Maya is Puerto Morelos, a quaint fishing town where the seafood and margaritas are sensational. Despite its proximity to Cancún, this salty seaside pueblo has retained its authenticity and lure, drawing expat artists and poets who have fallen in love with its slower pace.

Just past a mangrove shrubland lies the town square, etched by restaurants, cafes, and fisherman's shacks beckoning the next tourist out to sea. Near the infamous faro inclinado, or leaning lighthouse, is the town's true treasure, the Mesoamerican Reef. Located 1,800 feet offshore, this protected national park is home to a thriving 600-milelong barrier reef - the second longest after the Great Barrier Reef in Australia - and neighboring mangrove, with nearly 40 species of birds.

We snorkel by day and dine by night, sinking our toes into the sand and eating whole fried fish with our hands. We have our pick from hole-in-the-wall taco shops to finer restaurants like La Sirena and John Gray's Kitchen.


#### **MEXICO LINDO COOKING**

Just across from Puerto Morelos, Mexico Lindo Cooking school brings traditional recipes to the table with one of the best culinary experiences on the coast. Run by Alejandra Kauachi and Tomas Medina, these master chefs proudly share Mexico's rich gastronomy and family recipes handed down from generations.

Their kitchen secrets are revealed through classes, workshops, and chef's-table dinners. They even host immersive tours where you can explore markets and catch your own soon-to-be ceviche. Whether you choose to work for your food or not, you'll still get to partake of gourmet dishes in a jungle setting. Come hungry and pace yourself for salsas, tamales, pozole (stew), tortillas, and mucho más.

#### **BONANZA RANCH**

If you've ever dreamed of galloping along the beaches of Mexico, Bonanza Ranch on Rosarito Beach is the place to go. Saddle up for a tour through the Mayan jungle to take a dip in two cenotes and sample bubble gum in a zapote (sapodilla) orchard.



Like a scene straight out of *National Geographic*, the ride takes you past monkeys, birds, lizards, and other exotic wildlife. You'll learn about their habitats and the area's history from an experienced guide. Snacks and towels are included in the tour, and photos of your wilderness adventure are available for a small fee. An added perk is that all the horses have been rescued and rehabilitated, making this a truly unique way to experience Riviera Maya.

#### **XCARET**

Once a sacred Mayan city, Xcaret is now a 250-acre eco-archeological theme park that features underground rivers and a coral reef aquarium. On a hot day, that's where we head first. From the dark waters of the mangroves to the crystal blues of the reef, we dive in and snorkel to our hearts' content. The water is so clear you can see the bottom, as fish nibble at pylons and coral. Stingrays flap past sea stars as bright as traffic cones.

There's a lot to experience above the surface at Xcaret, too, including a butterfly pavilion and an aviary, as well as diverse performances such as The Xcaret México Espectacular, which features 300 artists sharing the history, traditions, and folklore of Mexico through music and dance. And nearby are several sister parks: Xplor (an adventure park), Xichén Tours (offering archeological tours of Mayan ruins), Xenses (a park that heightens the senses through interactive activities), and Xoximilco (a gondola tour of Mexican culture). Needless to say, you'll want to set aside an entire day for Xcaret. Or maybe two if you're staying in Playa del Carmen: The park is just 6 miles away.

#### **TULUM AND COBÁ RUINS**

There's no shortage of archeological sites in Mexico, but two of the most dramatic settings happen to be in Riviera Maya. The first, Tulum, is one of the region's leading attractions due to its accessible and appealing location on the cliffs above the Caribbean's turquoise waters.

Hordes of travelers flock to this walled Mayan city with its well-preserved ruins dating to A.D. 1200. This may just be the best photo op of your trip, with temples fronted by iguanas basking in the sun, and a backdrop of white sandy beaches.

If time permits, head to the less-congested Cobá. It's about a 45-minute drive inland from Tulum, but worth the journey. Spread across 43 square miles, this ancient city tucked in the jungle can best be explored by bike (available for rent). At the site are rugged, remote, white-stone structures from the late classic period (A.D. 600 to A.D. 900) — some of which are still climbable.

Save your Instagram shot for the 137-foot-high Nohoch Mul pyramid, the tallest Mayan structure in the Yucatán. Make the climb for breathtaking views and thigh burn at the top of 120 steps.

#### **CENOTES**

If you're still longing to get your feet wet, visit any of the Yucatán's 7,000 cenotes. Considered sacred pools by the Mayans, today you can swim, snorkel, and dive in these freshwater sinkholes and subterranean chambers bordered by impressive limestone formations.

Our three favorites are Aktun-Chen near Tulum, and Chikin Ha and Kantun Chi, both neighboring Playa del Carmen. The best way



to experience local cenotes is through Secret Footsteps. This company educates visitors on everything from the underground rivers to the Mayan civilization that inhabited the area.

#### **SIAN KA'AN BIOSPHERE RESERVE**

In the southern region of Riviera Maya, civilization fades and unparalleled beauty begins at Sian Ka'an Biosphere Reserve. The bulk of travelers turn back at Tulum, but a minimal-effort drive 15 miles south will take you to lush landscape, serving as a refuge for crocodiles, turtles, monkeys, jungle cats, and 345 species of birds, including yellow-tailed orioles and Yucatán jays.

Declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in the late '80s, this protected region is home to Muyil, a small Mayan site next to the Chunyaxché lagoon. Take a short boat ride along the river, then float in a life jacket on a 1,000-year-old canal, past four ecosystems of jungle, wetlands, mangroves, and lagoons, where manatees munch on seagrass below the surface.

#### **AKUMAL**

This protected bay meaning "place of the turtles" holds true to its name. Navigate the glassy waters with 500-pound turtles, or snorkel farther out to sea for abundant coral and marine life. Akumal Dive Center has gear and guides for rent, and it's right by La Cueva del Pescador, one of the best seafood restaurants in town. Even if you don't plan on plunging into the sea, come for the thick powdery sand and the nearby cenote, accessible through a jungle pathway.

During our week in Riviera Maya, we taste traditions of Mayan communities, embrace the sacred sanctuaries of historic ruins, bathe in the beauty of cenotes, and gain a deep respect for the cultural identity of the Mexican Caribbean.

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



#### BRANSON'S SECRETIVE SPIRIT COMES OUT INTO THE OPEN.

"How can I distract you today?" Jenny asks us with her sly smile and country accent as we enter a tiny cottage in the woods of southern Missouri's Ozark Mountains. Jenny's job is to ply us with moonshine made in the cabin's basement. But this is no unlawful encounter — everything is perfectly legal. In recent years, Branson distillers have emerged from the shadows of an illicit past into the modern-day industry of craft spirits.

#### A NOT-SO-CLANDESTINE BUSINESS

Making the drive to **Copper Run Distillery** in the hills north of town can feel like searching for a secret location still hidden in the woods. Once you turn off Highway 65 onto Bear Creek Road, the shoulder disappears, and trees line the path that winds past bucolic horse ranches. As it curves farther into the forest, the road's authentic, rugged character begins to emerge. After careful driving over a few cracks



in the asphalt, Copper Run's entrance, consisting of a pyramid of whiskey barrels, appears.

The building doesn't look like much from the outside, but inside the rustic structure are shelves of distilled spirits, and behind the bar, the friendly, yet assertive, Jenny holds court. Besides moonshine, Jenny has rum, whiskey, bourbon, and spirit infusions to use in her cocktails. She crafts all of the bar's selections with seasonal fruits, vegetables, and herbs. I let her distract me with a Copper Run bloody mary. Jenny makes the bloody mary mix with red, yellow, and green peppers; rosemary; red onions; and coarse garlic from her personal garden. She garnishes the cocktail with a pickle, olive, celery salt, and pepperoncini. The taste is warm and satisfying, like a spring day in the Ozark hills.

We scoff when Jenny announces all six of the distillery's products are made on-site in a 140-gallon pot still in the basement. To prove it, she insists on giving us a tour. From behind,







the building has a walkout cellar carved into the hillside that holds a copper still, a corner bottling area, and a small barrel room — Copper Run truly boasts authenticity down to every rustic detail.

Jim Blansit founded Copper Run Distillery in 2009 after many years of working in California's brewing industry. He returned to Branson to open Taney County's first distillery — located on land his family farmed for generations — since Prohibition ended in 1933. Blansit's dad, also Jim, named the distillery and lives next door. The tasting room has a dog-friendly back deck, and live music and food trucks on weekends.

#### **WHAT IS MOONSHINE?**

Moonshine simply is any unaged, clear grain spirit, commonly perceived as a high proof, illegal, bootlegged liquor distilled deep in the Appalachian Mountains. However, the line of illicit stills that ran from Virginia through Kentucky during the Prohibition Era also stretched into the Ozark Mountains of southern Missouri. Backcountry distillers would use sugar cane to sweeten the spirit, and others would add fruits and spices to give it even more flavor. Today, a new generation of legal distillers is changing public opinions about moonshine by making artisanal, small-batch, high-quality products with a mix of traditional and modern techniques.

Greg Pope of **Missouri Ridge Distillery** might be the most famous of the bunch after appearing last year in the premiere episode of Discovery Channel's *Moonshiners: Whiskey Business*. Pope is a third-generation distiller; his grandfather made moon-

shine in Utah's Rocky Mountains during Prohibition. "I'm just the first generation to do it aboveboard," Pope laughs. He then provides a quick moonshine lesson. "The simplest explanation [of moonshine] is any clear, non-taxed liquor," he begins. "The lore or legend behind it requires a little longer story. If you go with a traditional recipe, it is a blend of sugar cane and grain. Because it's got cane in it, you can't call it whiskey, and because it's got grain, you can't call it rum."

Pope's distillery and restaurant are located northwest of downtown Branson, just off Highway 465. He and his wife, Jolie, moved to Branson specifically to open Missouri Ridge. A Nebraska native, Jolie spent summer vacations in Branson as a youth and has always loved the area. "I tried to convince her to move to Alaska," says Pope. "When we got here, I told her, 'It's Alaska green, but warm, so I'm in."

Among its many spirits, Missouri Ridge offers a Howlin' Hounds moonshine and a 100-percent corn whiskey (both at 100 proof), a white lightning at 140 proof, and three flavored whiskeys: apple pie, peach, and honey. Made with super-sweet corn from Illinois and sugar cane from Louisiana, the sweetness comes through immediately when sipped. The apple pie and peach flavors both remind me of fruit cobbler, right down to a hint of a buttery cinnamon crust at the finish.

#### **MOONSHINE GOES UPSCALE**

Crown Valley Brewing and Distilling Company began as a vineyard in St. Genevieve, Missouri, in 2002. As the winery expanded, the

owners opened a brewery and distillery in 2008, making a variety of beverages, including craft sodas. The company set up shop on the Strip of Branson's Highway 76 in 2015 as **Crown Valley Branson**.

"Branson has been extremely welcoming," says general manager Tena Smith. "It's something new. They've had the wineries for years, so we were the first distillery [inside city limits]." Crown Valley Branson is part bistro and part storefront with a small-batch distillery in the back. While the tasting room serves and sells every product Crown Valley makes, including meats and cheeses, Branson is the only location that produces a classic corn moonshine and four flavored whiskeys: nutty honey,

cocoa espresso, cinnamon, and, the company's most popular, cherry maple. Made with all-natural flavorings, Smith says cherry maple whiskey is a perfect taste of all things Branson.

"We have lots of maple syrup and fruit orchards, so I would identify that flavor with Missouri." Smith even cooks with cherry maple, using it for bread pudding, barbecue sauce, and even bourbon pancakes. She recommends substituting a bit of the whiskey with water — about a quarter cup. "These pancakes are for adults only because the cooking is not hot enough to cook off all the alcohol," she advises.

Smith, whose hospitality background is from the wineries of Southern California, personally prefers Crown Valley's Washtub gin and uses it in a variety of the tasting room's cocktails. "The nose on it is just so soothing," she says. "While most gins are heavy on the juniper and pine with a wintery taste, our gin is more like an indoor sauna that's warm, inviting, and sparkling." Try it for yourself in Smith's signature gin and tonic. She makes it without the lemon twist because the gin already contains citrus.



While only adults can indulge in moonshine, here are some Branson activities to experience with the entire family:

Moonshine Beach Recreation Area: Don't let the name fool you: Adults and kids can enjoy this large sandy beach on Table Rock Lake.
Just a few miles west of downtown Branson, Moonshine Beach offers a swimming area, scuba diving, fishing, volleyball, and picnicking. Table Rock Lakeshore Hiking Trail runs about 2 miles from the visitors' center to Table Rock State Park Marina with stunning lake views. The beach has accessible facilities.

Branson Scenic Railway: A 40-mile journey on this historic railroad passes through tunnels, over trestles and bridges, and through the awe-inspiring Ozark wildness of Missouri and Arkansas. The depot is located in downtown Branson and operates three to four rides daily, depending on the season.

Dogwood Canyon Nature Park: Set on 10,000 acres, Dogwood Canyon is a 40-minute drive southwest of downtown Branson. View breathtaking waterfalls and fish in beautiful canyon streams and ponds; hike, bike, or Segway the 6.5-mile paved trail; or go horseback riding. You can also enjoy a ride aboard the Wildlife Tram Tour, where you'll cross the Arkansas border for a chance to spot herds of bison. elk, and other cattle.



**Fritz's Adventure:** This indoor activity park is open year-round. Thrill seekers can experience 80,000 square feet of vigorous activities such as climbing, tunneling, suspension bridges, and zip lining. Fritz's can also accommodate guests with disabilities; just ask for special accommodations at the front counter.

Parakeet Pete's Waterfront Zipline: Parakeet Pete's zip line over Lake Taneycomo at Branson Landing offers a large multi-cable ride with a double-chair ski-lift seat that makes experiencing a zip line easy and comfortable for everyone. The chair is slowly pulled backward to the opposite side of the lake before being released for the return flight safely over the water.



Smith offers complimentary 30-minute distillery tours to anyone who makes a tasting room purchase. Group tours are available by calling the distillery directly.

#### **BELLY UP TO THE BAR**

Branson's newest distillery is **Smith Creek Moonshine**, which began with moonshine in 2015 and now makes whiskey and vodka. While the production still is located about 4 miles away, Smith Creek has a tasting room, retail outlet, and barbecue restaurant in Branson Landing, the city's outdoor shopping and entertainment mall along Lake Taneycomo.

"I feel like a real moonshiner when we drive up there," says Sarah, a tasting room bartender, about the trip to Smith Creek's country still. "We do all small-batch distilling," she adds enthusiastically, "Every one of our bottles [is] signed by one of our distillers." The off-site distillery makes the moonshine and then transports it in containers to three tasting rooms: the flagship location in downtown Branson, and two in Tennessee, both for bottling and labeling.

The distillery currently makes straight moonshine at 100 proof, an 80-proof vodka, and 11 flavored moonshines from apple pie to chocolate silk to salted caramel, all at 50 proof. Guests can taste, in tiny amounts, any flavor they desire, and Sarah will guide adventurous moonshiners through all 13 flavor profiles. All visitors have to do is bring a driver's license as proof of age, and belly up to the bar.

Smith Creek's straight moonshine has the pleasant, earthy taste of corn mixed with the sweetness of sugar cane. The distillery's vodka is also made with corn, rather than potatoes, for another unique taste. Sarah has a cocktail suggestion for every flavor the distillery makes, and informs us that lemon-lime moonshine makes a great substitute for triple sec in a margarita. Recipes are available on the distillery website, so you can re-create the bar experience at home once you settle on a favorite flavor.

So, if you're still under the impression that moonshine is an inferior

spirit, perhaps a visit to Branson is in order to set your taste buds straight. With so many enticing flavors and cocktails, you'll need a designated driver to enjoy them all responsibly.

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# wonderfully wild



# The endless beauty of **Scotland**'s landscapes has inspired the works of famous writers, poets, and artists for centuries. BY SOPHIE COLE



#### **LOCH LOMOND AND THE TROSSACHS**

I meander along nature trails in Loch Lomond and the Trossachs, excited to follow in the footsteps of acclaimed creatives whose works have brought many to these lovely banks.

Spanning 720 square miles, Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park is an icon of Scotland's scenery. This remote and scenic place drove Sir Walter Scott and William Wordsworth to write their adventure novels and poems during the Romantic Age, sparking a surge in the area's popularity.


At Trossachs pier, I hop aboard the classic steamship *Sir Walter Scott*, and travel the length of Loch Katrine, featured in Scott's poem "Lady of the Lake." Published in 1810 and written during a family vacation in the Trossachs, the narrative prose brought the region to life. Shortly after its publication, Victorian sightseers flocked to the loch to see the captivating land for themselves. It wasn't just the visitors who were enthralled: A young Franz Schubert, also inspired by Scott's epic, wrote one of his best-known pieces, "Ave Maria," to the words of the famous poem.

Ferrying across Loch Katrine on the 118-year-old steamship feels much like traveling through history. The wild green expanse shows few signs of modernization, and time is seemingly static: It could very well be the 19th century to an outsider. Gliding along mysteriously dark waters, reaching depths of up to 320 feet, the boat passes forest-filled banks, Ellen's Isle, and Brenachoile Point — a popular film location, featured in movies including Alfred Hitchcock's *The 39 Steps* and the 2008 thriller *Doomsday*, and season two of the Starz original series *Outlander*. Every now and then, a blanket of bright-white mist momentarily swallows the

distant mountains and obscures the view, reducing visibility to foggy silhouettes. The eerie conditions accentuate the dramatic setting.

We disembark at Stronachlachar pier, and I switch my mode of transport to a hybrid bike designed for road and mountain conditions. Pedaling along the tarmac lane, which weaves around ancient oak-twined shores, and whizzing past gushing mountain waterfalls, I cycle back to the starting point, a two- to three-hour ride away. The route is remote and utterly tranquil. In Scott's famous poem "Lady of the Lake," he describes Loch Katrine and its peaceful surroundings as "so wondrous wild, the whole might seem, the scenery of a fairy dream." This verse could also be applied to the Trossachs; there is something enchantingly quaint and timeless about the landscape.

As depicted by these poets, the charm of the Highlands comes alive when you explore on foot. Well-marked trails weave through forests, zigzag up mountains, and provide breathtaking vistas, and often, a bench at the top. At Inversnaid, I climb the steep 1.5-mile RSPB (Royal Society for the Protection of Birds) nature trail through marvelous oak trees. I am rewarded with a superb view of northerly Loch Lomond from above. Along the way, wood warblers and redstart birds swoop before my eyes, and the sound of water trickling down from rocky hillside rivers forms nature's soothing melody.

On lower ground, traversing the rugged terrain along the loch, I reach Rob Roy's cave. Legend has it that the cattle-rustling fugitive Rob Roy MacGregor — depicted as a Scottish Robin Hood—like hero in Scott's adventure novel Rob Roy — took refuge on these shores with his family after their home was burned to the ground. It was here that he planned many of his scandalous activities as an outlaw.

Back in 1803, a trio of prolific poets and writers — William Wordsworth, his


sister Dorothy, and friend Samuel Coleridge — traveled through the Trossachs, writing along the way. William composed the poems "Stepping Westward" and "A Highland Girl," while Dorothy documented their six-week, 663-mile journey in her travel memoir *Recollections of a Tour Made in Scotland*, published in 1874. Traveling by horse and carriage, and exploring mostly on foot, the Wordsworths described the land as "a grand and solitary region."

Following in their footsteps, I stroll along the shores of Loch Ard before sunset, noticing the stillness of its waters. As light fades to dusk, the lake has a kaleidoscopic quality; the shimmering loch reflects translucent skies and towering pine trees. Two ducks non-chalantly swim past, stirring up the calm waters and leaving a rippled trail behind them. In an instant, the mirage is lost.

After a day of exploration, The Forth Inn, a traditional pub in the heart of the quaint village of Aberfoyle, provides a chance to relax and refuel. It is here that I delve into a hearty haggis burger (when in Scotland!) and enjoy the good cheer and merriment. It's a place where you can mingle with locals, and sample a shot of whisky or enjoy one of the craft beers on tap. Well worth a peek the next day, The Wee Tablet shop is a cute confectionary in Aberfoyle. I choose from their selection of sugary treats, settling on some authentic

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Scottish tablet - similar to fudge - and a scoop of freshly made ice cream.

What strikes me most when traveling around the Highlands is the welcoming nature of the locals. They seem to have an innate appreciation and knowledge of their land, which is apparent whenever I ask for directions. They know the best hidden gems to visit. When I stop by Callander for a coffee, cake, and gift shopping, the store owner recommends a visit to nearby Balquhidder to see Rob Roy's grave. Taking her advice, I make an impromptu detour farther north of Loch Lomond, and enjoy a hike around a different, equally scenic part of the Trossachs before my stay nears its end.

#### **THE CAIRNGORMS**

Driving toward the Cairngorms region, Britain's largest national park, an expansive mountainscape blurs past my eyes. Keen to explore, I head straight for CairnGorm Mountain, an outdoor adventure play-ground that attracts skiers during winter and hikers come summer. Visitors who want to travel up the mountain without the climb can take a ride on the funicular railway (weather permitting). I ascend the aptly named Windy Ridge Path, followed by the Summit Path. Reaching the peak, a vista of mountains extends as far as the eye can see.

The Cairngorms' cool climate is the perfect habitat for a herd of 150 free-roaming reindeer that live in the hills. Previously native to Scotland, the reindeer were reintroduced to the mountains in 1952, where they have since flourished due to the sub-Arctic conditions and tundra vegetation that they perennially graze on. You can meet the sweet-natured animals on a two-hour hill trip, or visit some of them at the Glenmore paddock.

Afterward, I head to the town of Aviemore, where art galleries showcase the works of local artists, many who have been influenced by the dramatic scenery. In Boat of Garten, I pass by 1896 Gallery & Coffee Shop to admire some of James Gordon's landscape photography. He manages to capture the light and constantly changing

climate of the Cairngorms in its rawest form. It's a cozy place to wrap your hands around a cup of tea after a morning of adventure on the Munros — mountains in Scotland that reach more than 3,000 feet — and admire paintings by Scottish artists that line the walls upstairs.

All these adventures feel like a step back in time; a refreshing tonic from the fast-paced world we live in. While the Victorian depictions of the Scottish Highlands are surprisingly current (minus the horse and carriage), the land of the Scots remains as it always was — mesmerizingly grand and wild.

Less than three hours from New York City, Callicoon is a gateway to the rural charm and slow-paced vibe of the Catskill Mountains region, where nature activities abound — and a delicious local lager is never too far away.

**What to do:** Go outdoors. Miles of trails traverse the nearby mountains. There are easygoing nature walks along waterfalls and more challenging all-day treks to the tops of majestic peaks. Or simply take a leisurely stroll through downtown Callicoon — and any of the other little hamlets — to enjoy not only the pleasant weather, but also the friendly small-town atmosphere.

Where to do it: The Ice Caves and Verkeerderkill Falls Trail is arguably the most unique hike in the area. In the span of approximately 7 miles, you'll walk through a verdant forest; take in a spectacular view from atop a large stone outcropping; negotiate narrow, (often) ice-lined rock fissures; and witness a 180-foot waterfall.


**Why go now:** As daytime spring temperatures melt away the last snowy remnants of winter, you'll see flowers and trees starting to bloom, but still feel as though you have the place to yourself before the summer travelers begin to arrive.

**Insider's tip:** Mix with locals at the Callicoon Brewing Company. The Reuben sandwich, variety of New York craft beers on tap, and comfortable setting will have you feeling like a regular in no time.

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Argentina's Entre Ríos province is north of Buenos Aires and bordered by the Paraná River to the west and the Uruguay River to the east. **What to do:** Settle in for some serious rest and recreation. Horseback riding, golf, and fishing for dorado, a regional favorite that grows to impressive size here, are all options. Relatively new to the local relaxation scene, though, are various hot springs resorts, where visitors can soak away their troubles.

**Where to do it:** The Uruguay River — and the towns along its bank — is the focal point for nearly all activities. If you want to go after

some of those dorado, find an outfitter in Concordia. Both Federación and Colón are known for their hot springs parks that feature multiple pools with mineral-rich water that flows as hot as 109°F.

**Why go now:** The fishing is good almost year-round, but peak season runs to mid-May, and what better time to enjoy the hot springs than when the weather starts to cool during the South American autumn.

**Insider's tip:** To add a dash of urban flair to your bucolic vacation, head to Concordia. Its main plaza, 25 de Mayo Square, is surrounded by museums, government offices, and lively restaurants and bars.

# AN UP-CLOSE LOOK AT SAN FRANCISCO'S

LOMBARD STREET




ts eight hairpin turns have earned San Francisco's Lombard Street the nickname "the crookedest street in the world." And while today's visitors delight in the downhill-only slalom, the block-long twisted portion of turns was constructed in 1922 for safety reasons — with a 27 percent incline, residents feared the street was too dangerous for the vehicles at the time.

To truly get the full experience of snaking — and braking — down

this zigzag of curves, you'll want to go by car. A sign suggests taking the drive at a cautious 5 mph. You can also ride a cable car up the hill and traverse down by foot. At the top, discover views of San Francisco Bay, the Bay Bridge, and Coit Tower. Stroll down the steep redbrick path lined with stately Victorian homes and manicured lawns where, at the bottom, postcard-worthy shots of cars winding down past colorful blooms of hydrangeas and roses await.

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
